Meeting Notes

Welcome & Agenda Review

• The approval of meeting minutes is a new process that the co-chairs have recommended in order to improve transparency and cohesion between meetings and members

Establishing a Common Agenda and Norms

- Education Co-Chair, Staci Dent, gave a presentation on setting norms that included educational resources and best practices from <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>.
- The group did not have enough time to address establishing a common agenda. This will be included on the March meeting agenda.
- Partners were assigned to breakout rooms to brainstorm norms for working group meetings and the actions that should be taken if you feel that someone is breaking the group's norms.
- Partners expressed the following key points as part of group norms:
 - Encourage actionable conversations
 - Prioritize finding and developing solutions
 - Establish action items following each meeting
 - Engage through respectful listening and participation
 - Provide constructive feedback as part of active listening
 - Be succinct and respectful when participating in the conversation
 - Use the "raise hand" Zoom feature
 - Avoid tangents not relevant to agenda item or partners in attendance
 - Respectful language: No ethnic and gender-based humor



- Focus on consistency:
 - Promote participant buy-in for more consistent meeting participation and attendance
 - Address all agenda items
 - Agenda should be clear and detailed
 - Use timecards or other methods to monitor time speaking
 - Include name of organization in your Zoom name

Strategic Planning

- The goal of this activity was to find ways to collaborate, re-address digital inclusion as a focus area, and leverage the planning for the EDA grant application (including proposed pilot projects) as potential activities for the group.
- The agenda item will be revisited at the March meeting with Partners finalizing working group activities for the next several months.
- Partners returned to breakout rooms to evaluate feasibility of activities proposed for 2021 and if they contributed to the activities of their respective organizations
- Key points expressed by Partners include:
 - Ensure funding and efforts goes towards needs
 - Needs assessments are important to developing an action plan and applying for grants. However, needs assessments are expensive to conduct.
 - Build a funding plan that prioritizes sustainable and long-term digital inclusion
 - o Career exploration
 - Include young people when working towards building economic mobility
 - o Capitalizing on existing resources, assets, and Partner activities
 - Map digital inclusion assets, gaps, and resources
 - Strengthen existing efforts vs. duplicating efforts
 - Resources can include educational activities and agenda items

<u>SANDAG</u> Digital Divide Taskforce Update

Antionette Meier, Director of Mobility and Innovation

- The Digital Divide Taskforce's mission and activities include:
 - Developing a data-driven framework and guiding principles that will culminate in a regional strategy by end of 2021 calendar year
 - o Interviewed 75% of jurisdiction for permitting and planning for broadband
 - o Focus is on performance and speed rather than specific technologies
 - SDG&E is now represented in the taskforce
- Partners suggested that asset maps include underground infrastructure to reflect fiber optics and bandwidth.

Partner Highlights

- Girls Take Flight: Elementary Institute of Science is recruiting participants from Title I Schools for this program, which teaches girls in 10th and 11th grade to build, program, and fly drones.
- Rental assistance:
 - Urban League: HUD certified counselors are available to help renters with forbearance.



- South Bay Community Services: Received funding to help families needing support paying rent. Email Robin Graham (<u>Rgraham@csbcs.org</u>) for up to 80% off back-rent
- San Diego County Emergency Rental Assistance Program: Beginning March 2, 2021, renters the San Diego region except for the cities of San Diego and Chula Vista are eligible to apply for additional rental and utility assistance grants.
- South Bay Community Services: Recently awarded a grant to support programming for justiceinvolved youth, which will begin July 1, 2021
- AmeriCorps recruitment: Ongoing recruitment activities for April and June onboarding, including an informational panel with the Jacobs Center for Neighborhood Innovation. Email Alex Southard at asouthard@sandiego.gov for more information about the positions.
