Welcome, Agenda Review, and Partner Announcements

Get it Done App

Marcus Lostracco: Get it Done App Coordinator, City of San Diego Performance & Analytics Department

- [The Get It Done App](#) is an mobile phone app for residents to report infrastructure issues for City departments to address. The app has been live since 2016 and offers over 50 services.
- Marcus Lostracco provided Partners with an update on the app re-release that includes a Spanish version, new features, and a modernized interface. Partners are encouraged to share these updates with the community.
- The Spanish version is based on the language settings of the mobile device. Translations are provided by the City Communications Department with manual translations to reflect the local San Diego dialect.

- Other updates include:
 - Artificial Intelligence (AI) capabilities for some reporting categories. For example, the app will match an uploaded picture of graffiti to the property category to list the report under.
 - New home screen
 - Improved maps
 - Confirmation page that allows you to modify details of the report before submitting.
- Get it Done reporting data can be viewed on the open data portal at <https://data.sandiego.gov/>.

Brainstorming Activity: Civic Engagement & Youth Leadership

- Promise Zone staff presented a draft list of priorities and potential activities that was developed from information gathered at the January meeting and conversations with working group Partners and stakeholders.
- Meeting attendees were assigned to breakout rooms to evaluate whether the proposed activities relate to their work and community needs, brainstorm how to refine the draft priorities, and highlight organizations in the region already doing this work.
- During the breakout rooms and in the discussion, Partners indicated interest in:
 - Safe spaces in the community specifically designed for teenagers and young adults
 - Prioritize engagement with on the ground community leaders and organizations
 - Emotional literacy and wellness resources for suicide prevention, gang-involvement interventions, and asylum seeking families
 - Ensure the community is aware of free digital resources and improve digital literacy
 - Digital and in-person community outreach at schools, churches, and youth sports to highlight the Get it Done app
 - Digital equity and inclusion via the library system
