San Diego Workforce Partnership Career Portal

- Jobs Co-Chair Stephen Colón informed Partners of the SDWP Career Portal re-release, which will take place at the end of 2021.
- Updates:
 - The Career Portal will now be accessible to the public. Previously, the portal could only be accessed by participating community-based organizations or SDWP program participants.
 - Job opportunities can be filtered based on eligibility, age, residency, school, sector, and returnships.
 - Data and information used to build reports for funding will no longer be collected.

Strategic Planning

- The goal of this item was to solidify specific, short-term activities, and achievable projects that contribute to existing Partner efforts.
- Partners returned to breakout rooms to evaluate proposed activities:
 - Option #1: Digital Inclusion
 - o Option #2: Promote the San Diego Workforce Partnership Career Portal
 - o Option #3: Meaningful summer employment experiences for teenagers
 - o Option #4: Career exploration, applied education, and youth leadership
- Key points expressed by Partners include:
 - o Option #1: Digital Inclusion
 - This is woven through all options.
 - o Option #2: Promote the San Diego Workforce Partnership Career Portal
 - This falls under Options #3 and #4
 - Option #3: Meaningful summer employment experiences for teenagers
 - Summer employment provides safe spaces for youth, which is a priority for the community and Partners.
 - Transportation and accessibility are important considerations.
 - o Option #4: Career exploration, applied education, and youth leadership
 - Numerous Partners in attendance provide mentorship programs and applied education.
 - Extended job shadows and work based learning (WBL) internships are important for students and adults disengaged by the pandemic.
 - To leverage the regional STEM ecosystem, Partners could reach out to businesses and organizations.

- San Diego Continuing Education(SDCE) is offering <u>free</u> Google Suite courses and high school equivalency courses. Submit an outreach request (form attached) for an SDCE representative to highlight these opportunities at an outreach event.
- **San Diego County Office of Education** is working with employers for summer job opportunities and will be doing virtual recruitment events with the San Diego Zoo. Stay tuned!
- **The San Diego Workforce Partnership** is re-issuing its Request for Proposals to provide education, training, and employment services for Black young adults ages 16–24 who are not



working or in school in San Diego County. Subrecipients will deliver Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title I Youth services. This funding opportunity will be approximately \$600,000 in Year 1 with an option to be renewed for three subsequent years.
