# **COVID-19 Vaccine Resources & Updates**

Monique Bonniey, County of San Diego COVID-19 Response

- <u>Vaccines Open to Minors:</u> The COVID-19 vaccine is available to minors 12-17 years old now (Pfizer only).
- Host a Vaccination Event: Apply here
- <u>Project SAVE:</u> This is an effort to increase vaccine equity for all residents of San Diego County. If you are interested in these tabling efforts, contact Lizabeth Lopez at <u>Lizabeth.Lopez@sdcounty.ca.gov</u>.
- <u>COVID-19 Safe Business Practices Certification:</u> This is a certification course offered over 2-days on June 3 and June 4 to educate businesses to provide a safe environment for employees and customers.
- <u>Updated Face Covering Guidelines:</u> On June 15, the State of California plans to implement recent CDC guidance.
- <u>Vaccinated-ONLY Section:</u> Event venues may have fully vaccinated attendees seated in the same section as other fully vaccinated attendees (children <2 years of age are allowed in this section if they are tested) apart from tested attendees. Verification includes a physical or digital copy of the vaccination card.

# **Good Food Finder Presentation with Q&A**

- Good Food Finder: This is a new resource for farmers and customers to connect and allows customers to buy directly from San Diego County farmers. The resource started with 15 farms and now they are at 31. The website is now fully translated to Spanish.
- **Goal:** To highlight Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) farm stand opportunities throughout the County from small farms to farmers of color.
- **Features:** Advance search tools that allow viewers to see details about the farms.

#### **Sub-Groups Update**



- **Urban Agriculture Sub-Group Meeting:** Sub-group members provided feedback for a flyer on urban agriculture resources in the Promise Zone and sub-group members evaluated several potential projects to prioritize.
- Active Transportation and Active Living Sub-Group: This group discussed prioritizing the City's free bike rack for businesses program. <a href="https://www.sandiego.gov/bicycling/racksand-lockers/">https://www.sandiego.gov/bicycling/racksand-lockers/</a> Ahmad Erikat, Associate Traffic Engineer at the City of San Diego was present to answer questions about the program. Key highlights about the bike rack program include:
  - Once an online application is received, it takes up to 90 days for an evaluation to approve the site for installation. Upon approval, there is an additional 90day window for the installation. The timeline might be shorter, depending on department requests.
  - After a request is submitted, the requestor is provided a service number which they can use to check the status of the request. If the request is done through the Get It Done app, the status can be viewed on the app.
  - o Approximately 95% of the applications get installed.
  - Requests may be from an entity other than the businessowner. As a courtesy, the City contacts the business owner to see if they approve of the bike rack.
    The business approval is not necessary, but the City will try to get an agreement from all involved parties.
  - A narrow sidewalk is a sidewalk that is less than about 8 feet wide sidewalk. As long as there are 2-3 feet from any obstruction, the request should be approved.
  - Currently, for any new requests, outdoor dining/retail operations are taking into consideration. Most bike racks are not being removed for this issue (only a few).

- Healthcare Agencies Sub-Group: This sub-group was tasked with re-engaging partners. The sub-group will solicit feedback from Blue Shield of California to leverage the work they are already doing.
