<u>Voices of the Community</u> Nishal Mohan, M<u>ohuman</u>



- Mohuman works in the San Diego Promise Zone, in other parts of California, and with Promise Zones nationally.
- There are more than 80,000 people in the San Diego Promise Zone and 45,000 do not have access to home internet.
  - The U.S. Senate recently passed a \$65 billion Broadband Infrastructure Bill and will head to the House of Representatives this fall. Mohuman has been advocating for this investment to be made by the government and is invested in ensuring that the money goes to communities instead of major corporations.
    - As part of the Digital Resilience Coalition, Mohuman and a representative from the Electronic Frontier Foundation will be having a "fireside chat" to discuss the bill and how communities can use these funds on August 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021. - **moDAT** is a digital services navigator tool that Mohuman has developed in partnership with communities in need think of it as a kind of digital advocate.
  - The website is currently live at <u>modat.org</u> and is meant to help businesses, individuals, and CBO's expand their online presence or create one for the first time.
    - The website is also a place to search for digital services and digital onramps in the Promise Zone; it is available in Spanish, and they are working on making other languages available as well.
  - moDAT also will also have services specifically for small businesses, such as: a multi-language contact system; booking system; coupons; digital payment system; analytics; reviews; events calendar; privacy and security; education and digital literacy pathways for small business owners.

# Funding Highlights

- City of San Diego American Rescue Plan Funding Updates
  - Small Business and Nonprofit Relief Fund



- small businesses faced.
  Under a partnership with The San Diego Foundation, the City has officially launched a \$12 million Small Business and Nonprofit Relief Fund.
  - The application opened on Wednesday, August 11<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 AM and will close on Friday, September 24<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 PM.
  - It is <u>not</u> first-come, first-serve. Nothing will be reviewed or processed until the application closes.
  - Awards are between \$5,000 and \$25,000
  - ALL businesses in the Promise Zone or Opportunity Zone regardless of industry, previous funding, etc., are encouraged to apply
- Eligibility requirements include: located in the City of San Diego, in business before April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020, self-employed business, sole proprietors, corporations under 100 employees, and net profit under \$150,000 or gross revenue under \$250,000.

- The following documents are required with the application:
  - 2019 & 2020 Federal Tax Returns
  - Current City of San Diego Business Tax Certificate or other proof that states the business is located in or operating in the City of San Diego. Examples of other proof may include:
    - o California State professional license
    - 2019 tax filing with Schedule C
    - o County of San Diego Fictitious Business Name
    - State of California sales tax certificate + proof of at least one payment
  - W-9
- How-To videos are available in multiple languages and applicants can schedule 1:1 assistance appointments with the SBDC at no cost for help filling out the application.

- Microgrant Capacity Building Program



- \$300,000 available for nonprofits supporting small businesses impacted by COVID-19 in communities of concern.
- Awards are between \$5,000 and \$20,000 and are first-come, first-serve

- California Coast Credit Union Funding Application
  - On February 22, Council approved a resolution authorizing a five-year marketing partnership agreement with California Coast Credit Union to be the official financial services partner of the City of San Diego.
  - The agreement allocated \$60,000 annually to Promise Zone Initiatives.
  - The Promise Zone Communities Partner Micro-Grants will be awarded to Promise Zone partners for one-time community, social, outreach, capacitybuilding, training, and technical assistance needs that serve a lawful public purpose.
  - Types of funding to agencies:
    - Capacity-Building. Capacity building expenses may include but are not limited to providing technical assistance and/or specialized services, building a website, hanging banners, programming special events, or creating/updating directories.
    - Community Program or Project Addressing Barriers to Post-Secondary Education and/or Employment: Funds may be awarded for one-time community, social, and/or outreach for programming that addresses barriers to post-secondary education and/or employment, so long as it serves a lawful public purpose.

- LISC Funding Success
  - Received the Open For Business Grant from Wells Fargo.
  - \$750,000 from Wells Fargo are being pushed to business development organizations whose applications are being reviewed this week.
