Date: Sept. 10, 2021

Subject: Nov. 1, 2021, Deadline to Convert Existing Paper Projects and Plans to Digital

Starting Monday, Nov. 1, 2021, all previously accepted paper-based permit applications, plan resubmittals and stamp transfer/issuances for Building and Combination Building projects must be submitted electronically in PDF format. No more paper plans will be accepted after this date.

The switch to digital provides many benefits, including:

- Making it easier and more convenient to submit plans and other documents online 24/7.
- Aligning with the Development Services Department's (DSD) transition to 100% online permitting.
- Eliminating the need to provide multiple sets of plans for review and the physical drop-off rechecks at the downtown Development Services Center.
- Speeding up the stamp-transfer and permit process.

What You Should Know

1. All customers that started their building and combination building projects before July 1, 2020, must convert their paper-based project files into a PDF format.
2. Customers are responsible for scanning their paper plans into the PDF format.
3. Customers will keep the same review schedule.
4. When ready to convert, customers will need to complete a simple [online form](#) to start the process.
5. The final permitted plans will be electronic for easy downloading and printing.

How to Apply for Digital Conversion

Visit sandiego.gov/departments/paper-digital-plan-conversion and complete an [online form](#) requesting the conversion to digital. After receiving an email confirmation, plans and documents may be uploaded to [OpenDSD](#).

Converting from paper to digital is among the latest enhancements to the City's permitting process to help improve permitting experience and service delivery.
