Meeting Notes

Welcome, Agenda Review, and Introductions

- Co-Chairs welcomed Partners and led a culture share activity.
- Staff shared updates from the most recent Promise Zone working group meetings:
 - **Economic Activity** heard from the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) about the Community Economic Resilience Fund. City staff also provided a mid-year update on funding coming out of the Economic Development Department as well as an overview of the department's budget.
 - Healthy Communities welcomed Partner Financial Assistance awardees to share about their funded projects and find opportunities for collaboration. The City's Environmental Services Department presented on SB1383, which encompasses food recovery and recycling. Many of our Partners from the Healthy Communities working group are looking to hire Promise Zone residents for a variety of positions! We will be sharing some of those listings in the chat. This is a great opportunity for collaboration across working groups.
 - **Housing Affordability** discussed housing policy updates, extended eviction moratorium, and highlighted a homelessness services provider.

<u>Overview of the City's Proposed Budget for the Economic Development Department</u> Monica Hardman, City of San Diego—Economic Development

- The City's Department of Economic Development administers several key programs.
- BEAR is the Business Expansion, Attraction, and Retention team. BEAR supports small business engagement and offers industry sector support, including support with foreign trade zones, grants and loans.
- The Community Development Division houses the federal and state grant administration and the HUD programs team. The San Diego Promise Zone initiative also lives within Community Development.
- Strategic Partnership and Research is responsible for Successor Agency asset management, corporate partnership development, and economic research. This division seeks out new relationships and solutions in the private sector to achieve city goals.
- Business Operations and Support Services (BOSS) ensures that expenditures are paid. The Boss team also processes money and responsible for PRA management.



- The Economic Development Department offers grants and financial assistance, including a microgrant capacity building program which supports CBOs.
- EDD is putting forward operational changes to support priority projects. Its primary initiative is small business assistance. In the FY2023 budget, EDD asked for significant expenditures for the BEAR Department and Connect2Careers to help provide a wide range of direct services for small businesses such as BIDs. It is asking for the addition of non-personnel expenditures for the restoration and enhancement of the small business enhancement program with a focus on investments in communities of concern.
- The Connect2Careers contract is ending. Since there are no CDBG funds for this program in 2023, EDD is asking for \$750,000 to support opportunity youth and continue with other programs to support this goal.

SD Access 4 All Program Updates

- Digital equity emerged as a priority in 2020 with the pandemic. Promise Zone Partners focused on immediate and middle tier solutions such as hotspots and public Wi-Fi access points and Chromebook checkouts. The Jobs + Education working group will continue hosting digital equity workshops to support these essential efforts. Past workshops have resulted in the creation of 19 public Wi-Fi hotspots within the Promise Zone.
- Structural barriers prevent the implementation of the modern technology needed for fast internet speeds within the Promise Zone. This has been referred to as digital redlining. Fiber is a huge driver of economic development. The fiscal year 2023 budget will have funding to expand on these efforts.
- ARPA is funding Capital Projects and Affordable Connectivity Programs to support digital equity. The City is not well equipped to go after these funds because it needs a broadband master plan with a needs assessment in order to do so. Developing a broadband master plan will involve communities in mapping fiber gaps.

Working Group 2 Year Overview + Discussion

- Co-Chairs asked Partners to consider what activities this working group can revisit as related to our goals.
- The Jobs and Education working groups combined before the pandemic began and stayed together at its onset to focus efforts on addressing the shared priority of digital equity. In 2020, this working group collectively pursued an Economic Development Administration grant to receive a needs assessment specific to the San Diego Promise Zone. While this effort was not funded, this represents a major effort successfully undertaken by this Working Group, and these conversations would be later used to inform citywide advocacy efforts and a series of workshops.
- In December of 2020 we hosted the first installment of the Digital Inclusion in the Promise Zone Workshop Series, "Getting to a Common Agenda," which featured a Promise Zone Hotspot Mapping Activity. This information was utilized by the City's SD Access for All Digital Inclusion Initiative to help determine key locations to set up device and public Wi-Fi access.
- In May of 2021 we hosted our second Digital Inclusion Workshop, "Access to Connectivity," where we discussed the emergency broadband benefit, the expansion of



- Last December, we hosted our 3rd installment of Digital Equity Workshop focusing on digital device access in the Promise Zone. In partnership with the Department of IT we were able to assess what difficulties community-based organizations are facing when it comes to sourcing and distributing affordable, high-quality computers.
- Since August 2021, this group also planned and executed a 3-part Career Opportunities Event Series. This project fulfilled the group's priorities to Cultivate opportunities for career exploration, applied learning, and youth leadership.
- Co-chairs shared discussion questions with Partners and asked them to keep these questions in mind so the discussion can be continued online.

- Co-chairs reminded Partners that the next meeting will be in July.
