# City of San Diego Microgrants Overview

Viridiana Quintana, Economic Development Department—City of San Diego

- The <u>Capacity Building Grant Program</u> provides funding for 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(6) nonprofit organizations that serve small businesses within the <u>San Diego Promise Zone</u>, <u>Opportunity Zones</u>, and/or otherwise under resourced communities.
- The deadline to apply for this program is December 5, 2022.
- Award amounts are a minimum of \$10,000 to a maximum of \$30,000. All funds must be expended by June 30, 2023.
- Awards from last year includes:
  - <u>All For Logan</u> <u>"Walk the Block"</u>
  - Logan Heights Community Development Corporation Community Infrastructure and Business Promotion
  - <u>County of San Diego Black Chamber of Commerce</u> Capacity Building Programs for Black Business Owners

#### Small Business Enhancement Program Overview

Xiomalys Crespo, Economic Development Department—City of San Diego

• This fiscal year, the <u>Small Business Enhancement Program</u> (SBEP) was fully funded, with a \$200,000 allocation to flow directly to Promise Zone businesses. The creation and management of a San Diego Promise Zone Investment Fund would leverage partnerships to make financial assistance readily available for small businesses, to



address some of the most pressing needs identified by the Economic Activity working group.

- Under this program awarded businesses will:
  - Receive up to \$10,000 grants for:
    - Infrastructure Improvements and Acquisition (\$10,000)
    - Business Development and Technical Assistance (\$5,000)
    - Broadband Access and Digital Presence (\$5,000)
  - Be Matched with an Awarded Partner for Case Management and Outcome Reporting
  - Receive Additional Funding for Business Referrals (Promotora Model, \$20,000 from philanthropic funding at \$50 per referral, out of philanthropic dollars)
- Up to 3 Awarded Partners, depending on businesses' needs, will:
  - Be Matched with an Awarded Small Business for Mentorship, Case Management and Outcome Reporting, Business Ambassador/Promotora Training
  - Receive \$10,000 in compensation (out of philanthropic dollars)
  - Identify further resources that can specifically address businesses that cannot access federal and traditional banking funding

- Co-chairs asked what impact do Partners want to see in the Promise Zone going into 2023?
  - Partner expressed appreciation on relationships formed through the organizations that attend the Working Group meetings. They also expressed an interest in having in-person meetings.
- Co-chairs asked How frequently would this group like to meet in person?
  - Once a quarter in person and all other times on Zoom.
- Co-chairs introduced the idea of having Partner mixers to share space and connect with each other.
  - Several Partners expressed interest in hosting a networking event or community event to allow the group to connect in-person and meet with small businesses.
  - Partners also supported the idea of more frequent business walks and resource fairs.
- Partners would like to see a group directory and group calendar to refer small businesses to certain resources and services that Economic Activity Partners specialize in.
  - Staff is currently in the process of housing the <u>Asset Map</u> on a platform that will be more accessible to Partners and community members.
