San Diego – Council President Sean Elo-Rivera and Members of the San Diego City Council invite the community to honor Healthcare Heroes as we mark two years since the COVID-19 pandemic arrived in San Diego. This is an opportunity thank doctors, nurses, first responders and other healthcare workers for comforting us and healing us in our time of need.

"At the beginning of the pandemic, people opened their windows, banged pots and pans and clapped for doctors, nurses and other healthcare workers as they treated people for this new disease that was taking so many lives around the world" said Council President Sean Elo-Rivera. "This month we're reviving that spirit of appreciation and gratitude."

A proclamation honoring "Healthcare Heroes Month" for March 2022 will be presented to the Hospital Association of San Diego and Imperial Counties at ceremony in Balboa Park.
