Arrest Made in Mira Mesa Murder

San Diego – On Friday, April 22, 2022, just before 3:00 p.m., the San Diego Police Communications Center received a call of stabbing in the area of 8600 Pagoda Way. Officers from Northeastern Division responded and located two females, a mother and daughter, who had been stabbed at their residence.

The first victim is described as an 87-year-old white female. She was pronounced dead at the scene. She was identified as Peggy Brandenburgh.

The second victim is described as a 60-year-old white female. She was transported by medics to a local hospital and treated. She is expected to survive her injuries. Her name will not be released at this time.

San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene. Initial information indicated that the suspect entered the residence and immediately stabbed both victims. The investigation revealed that the suspect is Anthony Dwayne Siddle, described as a 59-year-old white male who was believed to have left the area in a dark grey Ford Ecosport with Montana license plates. Detectives obtained an arrest warrant for Siddle and began efforts to locate and apprehend him.

On June 1, 2022, at approximately 10:30 a.m., Siddle was arrested for his warrant in Cave Junction, Oregon by members of the U.S. Marshals Service and the Josephine County Sheriff's Office. Siddle was booked into the Josephine County Jail. Siddle will be extradited to California.
