**Update on Homicide of 14-Year-Old Juvenile**

**San Diego** – On July 10, 2022, at approximately 1:30 p.m., the San Diego Police Communications Center received a call of a shooting at Polk Avenue and 37<sup>th</sup> Street in the Corridor neighborhood.

Officers from Mid-City Division arrived at the location and discovered a male teenager down on a sidewalk. He appeared to have suffered at least one gunshot wound. Officers and paramedics began rendering life saving measures. Unfortunately, he was pronounced deceased at the scene. The victim is identified as Enrique Medina, described as a 14-year-old Hispanic juvenile.

San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene and began investigating the incident. At this point in the investigation, it appears the victim was walking in the area when he was approached by a group of Hispanic males. At least one of these males issued a gang challenge to the victim. As the victim ran away, the males chased him and shot him. The group then left southbound on 37<sup>th</sup> Street in a light-colored sedan.

The following are more detailed descriptions of the suspect group:

- (1) Hispanic male, 16 to 17 years old, approximately 5'04", skinny, wearing a blue baseball cap
- (2) Hispanic male, 18 to 19 years old, approximately 6'00", 160 to 170 lbs, medium build, wearing a gray T-shirt and black jeans
- (3) Hispanic male, 16 to 17 years old, husky build, average height, wearing a white long-sleeve T-shirt
- (4) Hispanic male, approximately 17 years old, unknown clothing

Detectives continue to work to determine the circumstances surrounding the shooting. Detectives are gathering and reviewing evidence and interviewing potential witnesses. This is an open and ongoing investigation.
