MONTH-LONG INVESTIGATION ENDS IN FIREARMS AND DRUG ARREST

Nearly two dozen guns, hundreds of rounds of ammo, drugs confiscated

The San Diego Police Department Ghost Gun Apprehension Team (GAT) arrested a man wanted for trafficking firearms and selling large quantities of narcotics throughout San Diego County. On November 9th, the GAT team with the assistance of SWAT, Special Operations Unit (SOU), Central Division's Crime Suppression Team, and the DEA Narcotics Task Force, served two search warrants in a month-long investigation.

The seizures were conducted at two homes:

- 1100 block of E Street - one handgun with a loaded 20-round magazine, one unserialized pistol with a detachable magazine and pistol grip with a loaded high-capacity magazine (classified as an assault weapon), high-capacity rifle and handgun magazines, a fully assembled firearm suppressor, prescription drugs, drug paraphernalia, marijuana, and \$50,000.
- 5400 block of Lake Murray Boulevard, La Mesa - 3.4 kilograms of cocaine, 77 grams of MDMA, 1,000 doses of LSD tabs, 240 bottles of Xanax, seven assault rifles (equipped with detachable magazine and pistol grip), one shotgun with a detachable magazine, 12 handguns and two suppressors.

Investigators arrested 18-year-old Harrison Stone. He was booked into the San Diego County Jail on firearms and drugs charges.
