

San Diego Promise Zone | Overview



About the Promise Zone

In 2016, the San Diego Promise Zone became one of 22 federally designated Promise Zones in the United States and one of only four in California. The San Diego Promise Zone covers a 6.4square-mile targeted area that spans East Village and Barrio Logan east to Encanto and is home to the City's most culturally rich and ethnically diverse neighborhoods, but also some of the most underserved communities. More than 80,000 San Diegans live in the Promise Zone, an area where unemployment is high (15.61 percent, pre-pandemic), and poverty is concentrated (39.06 percent).

Through the Promise Zone initiative, community-based organizations, direct service providers, residents, and business owners work with government agencies to streamline resources and deliver comprehensive support.

SD PromiseZone 2023 Working Group Updates January 2023

Economic Activity celebrated 2022 highlights and reflected on what Partners value most from the monthly meetings. The group gave feedback on next steps for the priority projects: working with California Coast Credit Union on increases banking resources, increasing broadband accessibility among small businesses and promoting Promise Zone businesses' ownership of rented spaces and buildings.

Housing Affordability welcomed US Department of Housing and Urban Development liaison Danette Martin, set priorities for 2023, and gave feedback on a Homelessness Resources Trifold. The group discussed the importance of finding leadership in more places and engaging with developers to increase the number of affordable developments in the Promise Zone.

Healthy Communities will discuss strategic planning and priorities for the new year. The group will also hear from Circulate San Diego about their data analysis project in the Promise Zone. The group continues to monitor the County's Community Food Production Grant Program to support partner sites and projects.

Jobs + Education will discuss it's planning for 2023, most importantly the Signature Event in the Spring. We will brainstorm vendors, approve outreach materials, and create a name for the event. Join us next week to contribute to the planning process!



- State of the City Address: Last week, Mayor Todd Gloria delivered his annual State of the City address highlighting his goals for 2023 and accomplishments of 2022. Read the entire address here. The Mayor announced:
 - More than 1,200 feet of new sidewalks and streetlights in the works. Read more about the "Ready to Rebuild" Initiative.
 - An executive order creating a 30-day review and approval process for 100% affordable housing developments.
 - 2,200 San Diegans ending their homelessness through City outreach programs and over 650 beds being added to City-funded shelters.
- New Shelter Opens: This month the Office of Mayor Todd Gloria announced that a 33-room, non-congregate shelter prioritizing seniors has opened in Little Italy. The shelter will give homeless San Diegans a place to stay until they are placed into permanent housing. <u>Read more about this exciting development.</u>
- New State Legislation: Several new state laws have come into effect since the beginning of 2023. Some to note include mandating pay transparency, a bill expanding the rights of California farm workers, and several new state holidays. Read more!


