Fentanyl and Opioid Awareness and Harm Reduction

William Perno, SAY San Diego

- Senior Prevention Specialist, William Perno, presented on the dangers of fentanyl and opioid use.
- He gave an in-depth presentation about the risks of fentanyl and opioid use, counterfeit pills, fatality rates, prevention methods, Naloxone, and the Good Samaritan Law.
 - Fentanyl is an extremely powerful narcotic, 100x stronger than morphine, 30-50X stronger than heroin. It is odorless and tasteless, meaning it can be undetected in any form including other pills and vapes.
 - In 2021, San Diego County witnessed 814 opioid and fentanyl related deaths.
 - In the United States, the leading cause of death for adults ages 18-45 is a fentanyl overdose.
- Naloxone:
 - Naloxone is a life-saving medication used to reverse an opioid overdose, including heroin, fentanyl and prescription opioid medications.
 - Throughout San Diego County, Naloxone can be delivered or picked up from the County of San Diego Regional Public Health Centers. <u>Full list of Naloxone</u> <u>distribution sites.</u>
- Good Samaritan Law & California Health and Safety Code:
 - In California, the Good Samaritan Law protects people who distribute naloxone from civil damages if the person "acted in good faith, and not for compensation; provided either emergency medical care or nonmedical care; and the care was provided at the scene of an emergency." Source: <u>CA Department of Public Health</u>
 - California Health and Safety Code section 11376.5, states that if a person experiences a drug related overdose and seeks medical assistance in good faith, they will not be charged with a crime.

Demystifying Apprenticeships

Ernesto Rivera, San Diego County Office of Education (SDCOE)

- As part of the College and Career Readiness Department with SDCOE, Ernesto's work focuses on workforce readiness programs.
- He has extensive experience on apprenticeships in San Diego County and provided a wealth of information regarding what apprenticeships are, how to find and apply for one, and the benefits of hosting an apprentice from both employer and apprentice perspective.
- Apprenticeship programs, approved by the California Department of Industrial Relations, typically last four years and are always free.
- Participants receive paid on the job training and classroom instruction through an educational partner.
