In Person for Agenda Items and Non-Agenda Public Comment:

Via Virtual Platform for Agenda Items and Non-Agenda Public Comment:

When the Chairperson introduces the item (or indicates it is time for Non-Agenda Public Comment), raise your hand by either tapping the "Raise Your Hand" button on your computer, tablet, or Smartphone, or by dialing ***9** on your phone. You will be taken in the order in which you raised your hand. You may only speak once on a particular item.

When the Chairperson indicates it is your turn to speak, unmute your phone by tapping the Unmute button on your computer, tablet or Smartphone, or dial ***6** on your phone.

ITEM 1: AT&T TECOLOTE RELO - PROJECT NO. 1071544

Staff: Nilia Safi City Council District: 2 Plan Area: Clairemont Mesa

Approval of a Wireless Communication Facility (WCF) for A Conditional Use Permit (CUP) and Site Development Permit (SDP) for the continued use of an existing facility consisting of six AT&T antennas mounted behind existing parapet on the roof of a multi-family residential building and the equipment inside a room on the 14th floor. The overall height of the building is 140-feet, 9-inches. The project site is located at 2875 Cowley Way in the RM-3-7 Zone within Clairemont Mesa Community Plan. The project is also in the Clairemont Mesa Height Limit Overly Zone (CMHLOZ) which has a max height of 30-feet. The building is previously conforming and was constructed prior to the adoption of CMHLOZ. The project requires an SDP Process Five for the alteration of existing structures that will increase the height of the structure. There is no change to the height proposed.

The project was determined to be categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Section 15302 (Replacement or Reconstruction) on March 8, 2023, and the opportunity to appeal that determination ended March 22, 2023. ITEM 2: LA MAESTRA HOUSING FOR HOPE PROJECT - PROJECT NO. 1064927

Staff: Xavier Del Valle City Council District: 9 Plan Area: Mid-City/City Heights

A Conditional Use Permit to demolish 2,770 square feet of existing structures and construct a four-story, 14,945-square-foot multi-dwelling unit affordable housing development that will include 20 transitional housing units and one on-site manager unit and associated site improvements at 4135 Fairmount Avenue. The project provides that 100 percent of the transitional dwelling units be affordable to low-income households at or below 60 percent of the area median income for a period of 55 years. The 0.11-acre site is in the Central Urbanized Planned District CU-2-3 Zone, Complete Communities Housing Solutions (FAR Tier 3), Complete Communities Mobility Choices (Mobility Zone 2), Communities of Concern, Parking Standards Transit Priority Area, and Transit Area Overlay Zone within the Mid-City/City Heights Community Plan area.

The project was determined to be categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15332 (In-fill Development Projects). <u>Report No. PC-23-040.</u>

ITEM 3: AT&T MISSION GORGE ROAD- PROJECT NO. 1054374

Staff: Andrew Razon City Council District: 7 Plan Area: Navajo

Planned Development Permit for the continued use and modification of a Wireless Communication Facility (WCF) by AT&T. The project consists of replacing six (6) panel antennas and retaining six (6) existing panel antennas with a total of twelve (12) antennas (four per sector). The project also retains nine (9) existing Remote Radio Units (RRUs) (three per sector) and consists of auxiliary equipment located in a 183-square-foot enclosure located on the ground level. The WCF is located in the CN-1-2 zone, in the Mission Trails Design District within the Navajo Community Plan area located at 8181 Mission Gorge Road.

This project was determined to be categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15302 (Replacement or Reconstruction). <u>Report No. PC-23-043.</u>
