MSCP's 25th Annual Report

This is the City of San Diego's 25th annual report on the status of the Multiple Species Conservation Program (MSCP) Subarea Plan. The report tracks the amount of habitat acreage that was either added to or lost within the City's Multi-Habitat Planning Area (MHPA) preserve.

The report also details the management and monitoring activities within the preserve, restoration projects conducted within MHPA Lands, and impacts that occurred as part of both public and private development projects.

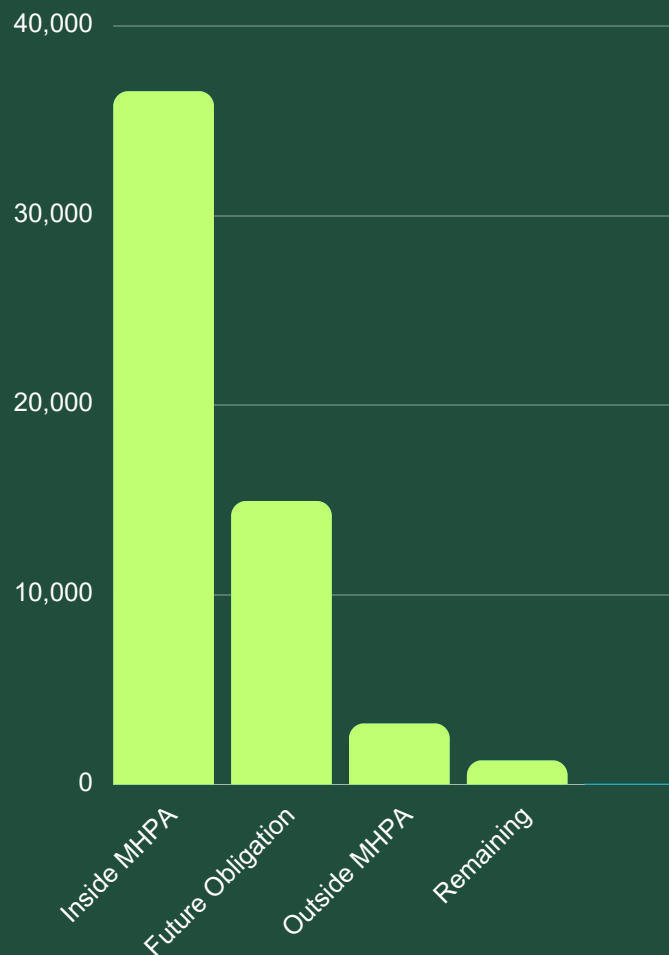


MSCP CONSERVATION GOAL
