## **Overview**

The development of the Environmental Justice Element will rely on inclusive community input to inform the development of goals, policies, and objectives. The Outreach and Engagement Plan has been developed to better communicate opportunities for public input and gather feedback from partners on opportunities to better engage the public. The Plan provides an overview of engagement that has been conducted up to this point, a projected timeline, types of activities that may be conducted with community partners, and the overall strategy for outreach and engagement.



## What Has Been Done So Far?

Building Awareness About the Survey Key Findings

The City of San Diego's Planning Department conducted initial outreach and engagement to build awareness around the Environmental Justice Element. This section summarizes activities conducted to build awareness and a high level overview of survey participation and key findings—up to this point in the process.

The online survey encompassed two questions that presented environmental justice issues and several more questions that captured the demographics of respondents. The first question sought to identify and prioritize environmental justice issues

being experienced by San Diego residents based on topics that will be covered in the Environmental Justice Element. The second question focused on broadening understanding of environmental conditions impacting communities. Demographic questions helped identify gaps and opportunities to broaden engagement. Together, these efforts will further inform engagement materials and activities to support and expand the reach of this initiative.



English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Tagalog, Arabic, Somali, Swahili, Korean, and Burmese.






## **TOP 3** environmental issues:

## Outreach & Engagement Strategy

A variety of methods will be used to reach stakeholders to share and receive feedback on issues related to environmental justice. This section outlines the outreach and engagement plan for the Environmental Justice Element.



## **Partner with Community-Based Organizations** (at least 5)

#### Collaborate Involve

The City will partner with community-based organizations (CBOs) to inform and support the development of the General Plan Environmental Justice Element.



Input from CBOs and non-profits will be incorporated into the Environmental Justice Element Outreach and Engagement Plan to support a strategy that is equitable, culturally competent, and effective.



The City will work closely with selected CBOs on outreach efforts and engagement activities to gather feedback, with the goal of reaching those most impacted by unique and compounded health risk.

## **Host Cross-Collaboration** Event

### Collaborate Involve

The City will convene a meeting and/or workshop fostering coordination and planning collaboration between organizations working to advance environmental justice in San Diego. This event will help identify opportunities to coordinate programs and implementation activities.

# **Design & Facilitate Community and Stakeholder Events** (at least 4) **Involve**

A variety of interactive and inclusive events will be hosted by the City throughout the life of the project to further obtain input from community stakeholder.

# Pursue Pop-up Outreach Opportunities Involve

The project team will host a booth at various community events to make information more accessible and reach community stakeholders to share more about the City's efforts to advance environmental justice.

## **Present at Public Hearings**

### Consult

Feedback gathered will be incorporated into the Draft Environmental Justice Element, which will then be presented at various Commissions and City Council for consideration and adoption. The public is invited to all public hearings to share additional information and listen to ongoing discussions around this initiative.

# Outreach & Engagement Strategy

## **ENGAGEMENT PARTNERS**

The City of San Diego has partnered with five community-based organizations (CBOs) to ensure the community engagement is inclusive and meaningful to people of all age groups and abilities. They will help gather feedback on the topics that the Environmental Justice Element will cover with a series of community pop-up events, workshops or meetings, bike rides or walks and community clean-up events. The CBOs were selected through an equitable application process, and an overview of this work is provided below.



**Bayside Community Center** is a non-profit organization working to empower its diverse community to improve quality of life through services, education, and advocacy. Bayside predominantly serves the Linda Vista community and surrounding neighborhoods.



**Bikes Del Pueblo** is an educational bicycle co-op empowering marginalized and under-supported communities through bicycle maintenance workshops that provide access to tools, parts, and inperson assistance.



**Casa Familiar** is a non-profit organization whose mission is to enhance quality of life for people living in underserved and underrepresented communities.



**City Heights Community Development Corporation** is a non-profit organization whose mission is to partner with residents in enhancing the quality of life in City Heights. The organization strives to build an inclusive and equitable community that embraces diversity, creates opportunities for all, and connects individuals to each other.



**The Urban Collaborative Project** is a nonprofit organization advocating for equity in the under-resourced areas of Southeastern San Diego by building capacity for local residents to overcome community disparities together in the areas of health, housing, art, transportation and infrastructure.

# Outreach & Engagement Strategy

## **ENGAGEMENT TACTICS**

A multifaceted approach will be used to ensure various ways of community involvement and empowerment to facilitate the development of the Environmental Justice Element. The various engagement tactics that will be deployed are described below.



Clean-up events identified will offer an opportunity to discuss environmental justice issues as community members come together to improve their neighborhood's cleanliness and aesthetics.



Walks and bike rides planned will create an opportunity to discuss and identify surrounding environmental justice issues that can be uplifted by the Environmental Justice Element.



Workshops and meetings will facilitate open discussions and knowledgesharing around relevant environmental justice topics, ensuring that community members have a platform to voice their ideas and concerns.



Pop-up events will also be organized at established events to meet the community where they are to gather input on environmental justice issues.

## **TOPICS COVERED**

The City of San Diego's Environmental Justice Element will focus on the topics listed below. To hear from community members in areas most impacted by compounded health risks, various events will be held by each of the CBOs to help inform the goals, objectives, and policies related to each topic—advancing environmental justice across the city.
