WHY: The lack of behavioral health beds means that San Diego is extraordinarily limited

in its ability to deal with the scope of the behavioral health issue that exists in the city today. Declaring a Behavioral Health Bed Crisis is meant to draw attention to the lack of beds – especially for low-income San Diegans and those on Medi-Cal

– and encourage a regionally coordinated response to the issue. The press conference also comes in the wake of Governor Newsom's push for voters to approve Proposition 1, which would build more than 11,150 behavioral health beds and 26,700 outpatient treatment slots, when it appears on the ballot for

March 2024.
