#### Mission

Our mission is to strengthen residents and businesses in Greater Logan Heights neighborhoods through community empowerment, education, economic growth, and housing development.

#### Project/Program Summary

Expand training and technical assistance services to increase reach to sidewalk vendors, home-based businesses, and micro-entrepreneurs, with a goal of improving business access and practice of fundamentals for entrepreneurs entering the formal economy city-wide.

Promote San Diego to the traveling public with superior customer service as well as referrals for and directions to hotels, restaurants, and attractions.

Provide Information and Referral services to 51,000 individuals traveling through transportation hubs in the City of San Diego.

#### Goal Alignment

Proposed program aligned with Goal C and primarily increases the number of San Diego hotel room night stays.

## **Funding Limitations**

### **Ineligible Expenses**

- Any activities already completed by July 1, 2024
- Proposal expenses incurred before July 1, 2024 or after June 30, 2025
- □ Travel or mileage
- Capital outlay for improvements and construction of buildings or facilities, or capital outlay for purchase of equipment
- □ Religious or political activity
- Programs in facilities not accessible to persons with disabilities
- **D** Tuition assistance
- Hospitality, e.g., alcoholic beverages, meals/refreshments, or entertainment expenses

- □ Lodging
- Contributions to trusts or endowment funds, or gifts or donations
- □ Profit making Organizations or ventures
- □ Replacement of deficit funds
- □ Ticket subsidy programs
- Penalties, fines, late fees, overdraft fees/finance fees
- □ Salary bonuses
- Organization Fundraising (e.g., galas, golf tournaments, fundraiser mailers, etc.)
- □ Job placement activities
- Indirect cost recovery (unless already permitted under another City Agreement)
- □ Lobbying



## **Application Process in 6 Steps**

Step 1	Carefully read the FY 2025 Economic Development Funding Program Application Guidelines
Step 2	Prepare your Sample Application in a format that you can use to cut and paste responses in the online Application. (Download the Sample Application in .doc or .pdf)
Step 3	If submitting optional attachments, gather those items to be uploaded in Section 5.
Step 4	Determine the representative from the organization who will complete and submit the SeamlessDocs online Application.

- 6. Conditions for Submission
- 7. Electronic Signature and Submission

Once the application is submitted, you can download and email a copy of your submission.



## **Completing the Application Online: Questions**

- Most questions are narrative with some multiple choice.
- Narrative questions are specific and require details on proposal.
- Provide succinct responses within character limits.

- Avoid repeating information under multiple questions.
- Be sure to respond to every question. Generally, "N/A" is provided as an option to respond. Otherwise, enter "0" or "N/A" if the question is not applicable to your Application or Organization.

## **Evaluation Criteria for Eligible Organizations**

### • Points will be given for organizational effectiveness:

- Was the application completed and submitted on time?
- Are all required document uploads attached?
- Does the Organization have experience managing grant funds?
- Is the Organization properly insured and in good standing with various government agencies?

### • Points will be given for Program/Project relevance:

- Are Program/Project objectives measured?
- Does the Program/Project connect to objectives and the City's Economic Development Strategy?
- Are targeted Program/Project participants appropriate and realistic?



## **Key Dates**

- Application Deadline: Friday, Jan. 19, 2024 at 5 p.m. (No late submissions will be accepted.)
- Preliminary Funding Recommendations Process:
  - **February/March:** Tentative recommendation and Program/Project Budget and Personnel Schedule, if applicable
  - **April/May:** Application recommendations submitted for the budget process and City Council Budget Review Committee hearings (tentative award amounts have historically been available in May)
  - Mid to late June: Final award amounts confirmed by City and documents due
