Project

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Advise the City of San Diego (City) Commission for Arts and Culture (Commission) to recommend the following panelists for the *here comes the neighborhood: Encanto* Public Art Project: 1) one Public Art Committee (PAC) member with recommended Public Art Committee member alternate, 2) Gaidi Finnie for the seat of the Visual Art/Design Professional #1, 3) Lani Bautista Cabanilla for the seat of the Visual Art/Design Professional #2 with recommended alternates, in no particular order, to serve as three of the five ad hoc artist selection panelists.

SUMMARY:

City staff will administer the artist selection process for here comes the neighborhood public art initiative. The artists selected for the second iteration of here comes the neighborhood through the competitive process will work with the City to create permanent, visually engaging and conceptually rich artworks for the Encanto neighborhoods in and around the San Diego Black Arts and Culture District. Up to three artists will be commissioned. The anticipated artist fee for each artist in the second iteration is \$40,000.

In alignment with *here comes the neighborhood* project plan, the artist selection panel for the second iteration will be composed of five voting members: a Public Art Committee member, two visual art/design professionals, a Planning Department representative, and a community representative, City staff members will attend the panel meetings as non-voting advisors. The Public Art Committee is authorized to recommend appointment of three of the five panel seats for the public art project.

In January of 2021, the PAC and Commission took action to recommend three of the five panel seats as described for the *here comes the neighborhood: Encanto* initiative. Delays to this initiative were incurred primarily due to the emergency implementation of the *SD Practice* and *Park Social* artist relief initiatives over the course of and emerging from the COVID-19 pandemic. In the intervening time, the PAC members recommended in January of 2021 to serve as panelists and alternates no longer serve as members of the PAC. Additionally, the Visual Art/Design professional recommended for Panel Seat 2 in January of 2021 is no longer able to serve. Therefore, staff recommends the following updates for panel seats:

Panel Seat 1

Panel Seat 2

Gaidi Finnie, Executive Director of the San Diego African American Museum of Fine Arts

Gaidi Finnie is the Executive Director of the San Diego African American Museum of Fine Arts. Finnie has a diverse and lengthy career in service of San Diego's arts and culture sector, including having served as a member of the board of directors or in management positions with North Coast Repertory Theatre, the Museum of Photographic Arts, Balboa Park Conservancy, and the Port of San Diego's public arts committee. With the San Diego African American Museum of Fine Arts, Finnie has organized

numerous exhibitions, many in collaboration with partner institutions throughout San Diego. These include the San Diego iteration of the Say Their Names Memorial, Black Life: Images of Resistance and Resilience in Southern California in collaboration with the San Diego Museum of Art, Legacy in Black in collaboration with the San Diego History Center, and Dimensions of Black in collaboration with the Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego, among many others. In 2020, Finnie served as an artwork selection panelist for the City's SD Practice collecting initiative.

Panel Seat 3

Lani Bautista Cabanilla, Manager, Community Impact, The San Diego Foundation

Lani Bautista Cabanilla is an arts administrator and community organizer with over 15 years of experience serving the arts and culture field. She was recently appointed as a Manager of Community Impact at The San Diego Foundation. Prior to that, she served as Senior Manager, Programs at The New Children's Museum in San Diego, where she collaborated with artists and community partners to develop innovative projects and installations that welcome over 250,000 children and families annually. In the last decade, Cabanilla has created arts education programs for five thematic exhibitions and curated dozens of hands-on studio experiences. Prior to joining the museum in 2008, she worked in community-based education programs, at independent design firms and on setdesign projects in Los Angeles. Cabanilla has a BA in Art from San Diego State University, an AA in Visual Communications from The Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising and studied Human-Centered Design at The Design Academy. She also serves as a Board Member and Managing Director for Made in Paradise Hills - PH Night Market in Southeast San Diego.
