Phase 1 Construction Spotlight

North City Pure Water Pipeline

The first portion of pipeline was recently constructed on Businesspark Avenue in Scripps Ranch as part of the City of San Diego <u>North City Pure Water Pipeline project</u>. In June 2022, construction began on Meanley Drive. Upon completion on Meanley Drive, construction will move back to Businesspark Avenue. Morena Northern Pipelines and Tunnels

Work is continuing along Executive Drive. Workers recently installed k-rail to prepare for pipeline installation moving east on Executive Drive from Towne Centre Drive intersection to the Executive Drive cul-de-sac. Morena Pump Station

The Westbound Friars Road closure from Napa Street to Sea World Drive was extended to from July 2022 to February 2023. The road will continue to be closed to all vehicle and pedestrian traffic. The eastbound lane of Friars Road from Sea World Drive to Napa Street will remain open, along with eastbound and westbound bicycle lanes. Crews are also working on pipeline installation on Custer Street as part of the Morena Pump Station work. See
