Meeting Notes:

Welcome, Introductions, and Agenda Review

- Co-chairs welcomed partners and reviewed the agenda.

Partner Announcements:

- Anne Fege (Kate Sessions Commitment)- The City has a new \$10 million grant and another \$5 million to establish trees in eight Communities of Concern (some in Promise
- Successful tree campaigns are repeatedly attributed to two factors which are: (1) Starting with asking what the communities want, then trees will be loved and live long and (2) Cities can achieve success with cross-departmental projects that accomplish public health, economic development, walkability-transit, climate action, EquityForward, Partnering for Progress, mobility, and others. - Ariel Hamburger (County of San Diego)- The County's Climate Action Plan (CAP) update is open for comment until January 5th.
- Carmina Paz (UCP)- The City is currently doing a <u>survey</u> for the Consolidated Plan.
- The Mobility Master Plan draft is currently available for public review and comment. UCP has reviewed it, and noted that there are not many CIP projects in District 4.

October Meeting Review

- SDPZ-The purpose of this section is to create and document a shared action plan of activities for this Working Group to take in 2024 to advance Healthy Communities goals.

Breakout Groups

Breakout Sessions #1-2: Healthy Food Systems

- Engage and align with existing food systems groups (SD Food System Alliance, Hunger Coalition) and food systems orgs (Kitchens for Good, Second Chance).
- Map existing efforts by HHSA, City, and partners to promote healthy food activities and leverage these with SDPZ (such as work by Project New Village).
- Identify leads for City subject matter expert (can support with general food system work, zoning for CBO-led urban agriculture and revitalization projects).
- New position is created that works across the City and County on food and agriculture policies.
- Investments on programming that will take administration.
- Support of the existing community.
- Use vacant, city owned land to grow food in urban gardens.
- Co-op spaces for community gardens, and community gardens in public housing.
- Monitor metrics and policies related to health and food access in the community.



- Intersection between environment we live in and what food we put into our body (studies proximity to grocery stores).
- Percent of the community within walking distance to a community garden (.5 miles radius or walking distance).
- Denmark policy: all apartment complexes come with community garden minimums. Could we champion this in the Promise Zone?
- Repurpose Agricultural incentive zones to promote new housing projects with innovative food growing techniques.
- Lifestyle impact on those who participate in community gardening.
- Research efforts of cities with robust community gardens and healthy food choices that are equitable.

Breakout Session #3: Infrastructure and Active Transportation

- Increasing trees within Southeast SD but also within the Promise Zone. Partner with other organizations such as Groundworks SD.
- Find out where the community wants trees and what good planting places are. Identify places and support and sustainability, get community support through pop-ups or canvassing the area, so the community knows what's going on.
- Looking for tree inventory data and want to identify sites with the community to see where available plots are, and asking which areas they want to prioritize first, two opportunities: Want to be already prepared with something to give to the City.
- How do these trees get watered? Planting trees in front yards, parks, maybe giving them hoses instead of paying truck to go around.
- Are there places to plant trees without waiting for community engagement? If waiting until they are engaged, underserving underserved communities even more.
- Active living is having safer streets, no one is going to use these trees and the space if it's not a safe healthy place to want to be.
- SANDAG has an Imperial bike plan; they need to come to this working group.
- Outcomes were the development of active program transportation for 4 roundabouts in San Diego. It's up to the City to submit this intervention, potentially reach out to them.
- Also, bus shelters, particularly in City Heights.
- Walking on concrete is not the healthiest thing to walk on, and sidewalk maintenance is expensive and not safe
- Maybe quarterly reports, sidewalk reports, traffic safety, give an idea of high priority area. Get It Done app, also sidewalks and maintenance (overgrown weeds that block the sidewalks).
- Should invite Get It Done to provide us updates on the kinds of reports that they get when it comes to street safety.
