 - The <u>Teen IDEA Lab</u> located inside the Logan Heights Library, has 3D Printers, a professional music studio, a GloForge laser cutter, Mac computers and more for youth 12 to 18. Adults are also able to use the space by making an appointment <u>online</u>.

City of San Diego Investment Snapshot

Michele Marano, Assistant Deputy Director, Economic Development Department

- Michele presented on the City of San Diego's Investments in the Promise Zone and asked for feedback from the group.
- The City has invested over \$2.5 billion into the Promise Zone since its designation in 2016. The investment snapshot and summary showcase how the money was used and will be presented exclusively at working group meetings in January prior to public release.

- <u>Objective 3:</u> Increase the number of students meeting school readiness and grade level expectations.
