Homicide Investigation in San Ysidro

On January 22, 2024, at approximately 4:07 AM, the San Diego Police Communications Center received a report of a shooting in the 100 block of East Calle Primera in San Ysidro. Officers from Southern Division responded quickly and located two victims suffering from gunshot wounds near a motel. Another involved victim was located near a gas station and the I-5 freeway a short distance away. All three victims were transported by Paramedics to local hospitals for treatment.

The first victim is described as a Hispanic male in his 30's. Unfortunately, he was pronounced deceased at the hospital from multiple gunshot wounds to his upper torso. This victim's identity has not yet been confirmed. The second victim is described as a 31-year-old Hispanic male. He suffered multiple gunshot wounds but is expected to survive. He has been identified, but his identity will not be released at this time. The third victim is described as a 20-year-old Hispanic male. He suffered from one gunshot wound to his lower torso but is expected to survive. He has been identified, but his identity will not be released at this time.

San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene and are currently investigating the incident. It is still very early in the investigation and detectives are still at the scene collecting evidence.

Based on the preliminary investigation, it appears the suspect and victims all know each other from living in the area. Detectives believe there was some sort of argument or confrontation that led up to the shooting, although details are not yet clear. After the suspect shot the victims, he possibly fled the scene in a white sedan. The suspect is described as a Hispanic male wearing dark clothing. There are no further details to release at this time.
