Talmadge Park is a neighborhood where I specifically chose to purchase my single family home. Talmadge is a neighbor that is relatively intact as it was built originally before WW2. Almost 100% of the homes in my neighborhood were built during the late 1930's or early 1940's. My home in particular was built in 1937. I have spent a considerable amount to keep my home in as much of the period style since 1989 when I purchased it. The historic value of Talmadge Park Estates is priceless because of its unique styles. Each home was individually designed & built by prominent people living there prior to WW2. Almost no two homes are identical and most homes are intact as they were when originally built. There are very few complete neighborhoods remaining in this part of San Diego. I began daily walks during the Covid shut down crisis. I've noticed more & more owners taking pride in their homes. There is a TRUE sense of community pride in Talmadge Park. If the neighborhood is not designated as a HISTORIC DISTRICT it would not be protected from OVERBUILDING and a SEVERE LACK OF PARKING. Since most homes in Talmadge have single car garages, there are an abundance of cars parked on the streets. In most cases, owners have 2 or more cars! Parking is at a premium already. It is essential to keeping our community intact to preserve our UNIQUE NEIGHBORHOOD from over building & crowded streets. There are children & elderly walking every day. If the movement to continue multi-use permits this will destroy Talmadge as it exists today. I would urge that the HRB not recommend amending the Nomination Report to explicitly consider future inclusion of subdivisions on the Kensington Mesa, which are separated by Fairmount Canyon. This recommendation is problematic because the proposed inclusion of the Kensington subdivisions would create a discontiguous district, which is discouraged by National Register guidelines. The Staff Report argues that Aldine Drive provides overcomes this discontiguity; however, Aldine wash〙t paved and named as a roadway until long after the development of the subdivisions was underway, and to this day does not provide safe connecting pedestrian access between the Talmadge and Kensington mesas. Further, only one of the Kensington subdivisions â€` Talmadge Park Unit 1 â€` has direct access to Aldine Drive. The other subdivision â€` Talmadge Park Unit 2 â€` can only access the other subdivisions by traveling through the main area of Kensington. (See the attached map for details.)
