#### Digital Bridge Pilot Program

- The San Diego Futures Foundation (SDFF) wants to go mobile and outlined the details in the <u>Digital Bridge Pilot Program</u> presentation.
- Their current site in City Heights, SDFF offers computer skills workshops, basic technology, and pick up of their low-cost computers.



- The Digital Bridge Program will allow SDFF to bring their services to communities that are unable to travel to their City Heights offices, ensuring access to essential technology and training right in their neighborhood.
- The program will not only fulfill the need for immediate technological assistance, but it will also provide their inters with more experience and confidence needed to pursue higher-level positions and careers in technology.
- SDFF is seeking sponsors to fund this program and purchase a van for their services to go mobile.

Review 2024 Agenda Items, Speakers, & Tactical Plan:

- The group reviewed ideas for agenda items and guest speakers for future working group members.
- Partners split into breakout rooms to finalize the tactical plans, developed in November. See below for notes from each group:
  - o Group 1: Ernesto, Irina, Maya, Pana, Roshawn, Sahian, Valerie, Zhenxi
    - The group focused on tactics to support the Career Expo on March 26. Partners in this group committed to promoting the event to their network. Access Inc. and MAAC Project committed to donate gift cards to the raffle. In November the group had they idea create a guide for employers about employing young people. Instead of creating a guide, the group will research if an organization has a similar one.

### o Group 2: Teresa, John, Rafiqa, Mauri, Edmond, Mary, Rich, Daria

 The group discussed the importance of identifying an individual's skills and interests before entering a middle-income job. They raised concerns about computer skills limiting people from entering the work force. To address their concerns the group will decide on measurements to evaluate the impact that careers fairs and education programs have on skill development.

#### o Group 3: Malia, Raquel, Sarah, Tomasa, Tyresa, Yanet

The group planned for Diamond Education Excellence Partnership (DEEP) to present at a future working group meeting about funding they received for a pilot program. The Promise Zone team will schedule a meeting with DEEP to discuss more partnerships. Additionally, the group wants to include Promise Zone schools in their discussions, and multiple members committed to inviting their school district contacts to the next meeting. For the end of 2024 the group will work with organizations like DEEP and the Office of Child and Youth Success to develop summer programs for Promise Zone youth.
