Storm Recovery Grant:

- The City opened a grant for small businesses and nonprofits to support flood relief.
 - The application opened on the Economic Development Department's website on Monday, Feb. 12 and will close on Tuesday, Feb. 27. Please track any expenses related to storm recovery in preparation for the application.
 Complete applications will be prioritized. There was a webinar about it a few weeks ago; feel free to reach out if you have any questions about the grant.

Diamond Business Improvement District Presentation: Donna Deberry (Central San

Diego Black Chamber of Commerce)

- Presented about their initiative programs.
- Programs will focus on creating generational wealth. They also highlighted several programs, all of which have represented underserved communities.
- The Urban Business Resource Center throughout the City and County of San Diego has assisted in over 3.6 million in grants and \$200,000 given in tools and resources to businesses.
- They have conducted surveys which show a 70% increase in business revenue and 50% increase in new jobs once they have completed their program.
- Important to Learn, Listen, Leverage. Lead with listening!
- Storytelling will be critical for improving and bringing more people from outside the community into this particular district.



• How can we collectively tap into each other's resources to make it feel like a good place for people to have their business and also for people to want to come in from out of town and enjoy the services of that business?

Walmart Closure in Logan Heights:

- Angie Mascena (Logan Heights CDC)
- Logan Heights CDC hosted a community forum about 3 weeks ago when they got word that the Walmart was going to be closing, since it was the only supermarket and pharmacy in Logan Heights.
- They wanted to collect the communities' input and advocate for what they want and need.
- Asked 3 main questions:
- **Question 1**: How will the closure of the Walmart impact you and your family?
 - **Answer 1:** It was going to increase the distance of travel to get groceries and medicine, also increase the length of travel since there are no other grocery stores or pharmacies nearby.
 - Loss of an affordable option, lack of pharmacy and loss of jobs. Also, residents are concerned about the economic progression for Logan Heights.
 - **Question 2**: What type of businesses or services would you like to see?
 - **Answer 2**: Some kind of supermarket, farmers market, or a shared space for small businesses to sell their goods. A pharmacy is for sure another top priority. Maybe a mixed used facility with affordable housing, bank on bottom and grocery store also on bottom.
 - **Question 3:** What type of business/ services do you not want to see?
 - **Answer 3:** No strip clubs, homeless shelters, dispensary, bars, warehouses, storage facilities, or recycling centers.
- The full report will also be included in the meeting minutes.
- Some potential ideas to explore are a cooperative grocery store and bringing in multiple tenants to support the various needs of the community, or a community-based organization who provides direct services.

Tactical Planning with Outcome/Metric Setting:

- The group briefly reviewed ideas for agenda items and guest speakers for future working group members.
- Partners were encouraged to review the tactical plans, developed in the November/ January meeting, related to the objectives of their subgroup.

Objective 1: Strengthen the Business Base and Attract New Businesses to Vacant Land
