1. **Call to Order** Anne Fege, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:00 am, February 12, 2020.

3. **Approval of Minutes** The minutes of November 13 and December 11 were approved.

# 4. Announcements and Updates

- a. Anne Fege summarized the Councilmember priorities for FY 2021 budget, listed in the Independent Budget Analyst report. Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 8 and 9 recommended increases up to \$1.7 million for urban forestry and some for managing trees in parks.
- b. Brian Widener announced the City's designation as a TreeCity USA for ten years.

### 5. Discussion

- a. Fege outlined issues relating to tree protection. Kristen Harms and other University Heights residents submitted a nomination to designate some historic trees on the Normal School property of the San Diego Unified School District (SDUSD). Street trees can be evaluated and considered by the City; trees on the school property have to be nominated by the property owner, which is SDUSD District.
- b. Laurel Ehrenfreund showed photos and described the issues relating to a large Brisbane box tree and a planned sidewalk installation, in Pacific Beach. She is hoping for our support in saving the tree.

## 6. City Staff Reports

- a. Widener presented the monthly report of urban forestry activities since July. There is a backlog of 1,090 of requests for "free trees" to be planted on street easements.
- b. Widener reported that the City plans to temporally suspend fees for a set number of sidewalk repair permits, required for work undertaken by residents.
- c. San Diego Gas & Electric is to plant trees to replace those removed, in utility line clearing and undergrounding lines, and there are some unassigned tree "credits" to be worked out with the utility.
