Out of State Arrest Made in Grantville Double Homicide

On March 1, 2024, at approximately 8:50 PM, the San Diego Police Communications Center received a report of a shooting in the 4500 block of Alvarado Canyon Road in the Grantville neighborhood. Officers from Eastern Division responded quickly and located two victims suffering from gunshot wounds inside the stairwell of an apartment complex. The victims were transported by Paramedics to local hospitals for treatment.

The first victim is identified as Joseph Taylor. He is described as a 31-year-old Black male. Taylor is a San Diego resident, but did not live at the apartment complex. The second victim is identified as Lavion Estridge. He is described as a 24-year-old Black male. Estridge is believed to be a security guard at the apartment complex.

San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene. Based on the preliminary investigation, it appears there was some sort of altercation among a group of people near the pool area inside the apartment complex. At least three people pulled out firearms and began shooting. These details will still have to be confirmed through comprehensive evaluation of the physical evidence. The purpose for the group gathering is still under investigation. This shooting is believed to be gang related.

On March 5, 2024, Charles Burke was previously identified as a suspect and arrested.

As the investigation progressed, Detectives identified Jacarre Easter, described as a 23year-old Black male, as another suspect. A warrant was obtained for Easter's arrest. On March 12, 2024, at approximately 6:00 PM, Easter was located and arrested by Hattiesburg Police Department in the 3000 block of West Fourth Street in Hattiesburg Mississippi. Detectives are coordinating with the District Attorney's Office to extradite Easter back to San Diego.
