NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit – Ragnar Relay SoCal 2024

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Otay Mesa-Nestor, Barrio Logan, University City, Torrey Pines, Carmel Valley, La Jolla, Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, Mission Bay Park, Ocean Beach, Peninsula, Downtown, Clairemont, Mira Mesa, Scripps Ranch, Sabre Springs

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 8

LOCATION: Citywide roadways/streets/parks from Torrey Pines to Downtown San Diego, NTC Park, Torrey Pines Glider Port

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for the portion of the Ragnar Relay So Cal 2024 for an approximate 200-mile relay run event that would occur within the City of San Diego right-of-way jurisdiction on April 12, 2024. At NTC Park, the event would include the use of tents, a generator, a finishing chute, fencing and/or barriers, pre-packed food, and non-alcoholic beverages, portable restrooms, food, trash/recycling containers, and sound amplification. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur within the City of San Diego from 3 AM until 10 PM on April 12, 2024. On April 12, 2024, set-up would occur from 3 AM until 5 AM, the event day 1 would occur from 5 AM until 6 PM, and dismantling would occur from 6 PM to 10 PM. Sound amplification from announcements and music at NTC Park would occur from 8 AM until 8 PM.

The attached maps indicate the City's portion of the run and the exchange points where the runners exchange the baton for the relay. A detailed description of the route can be found on https://www.runragnar.com/event-detail/relay/southerncalifornia#course

Runners would use sidewalks and trails, and no road closures or traffic rerouting would occur with this event.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego

conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
