NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit – La Jolla Concours d'Elegance 2024

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: La Jolla

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 1

LOCATION: Ellen Browning Scripps Park and La Jolla Village

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a 3-day event antique car show that would occur on La Jolla Village Streets and Ellen Browning Scripps Park on April 19 & 21, 2024. The event would consist of the temporary use of alcoholic beverages, cars, a stage, sound amplification, tents and/or canopies, tables, chairs, temporary structures, a beer garden, fencing and/or barriers, generators, onsite food preparation, food trucks, food sampling and prepackaged food, portable restrooms, recycling and trash containers, and entertainment. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from April 17, 2024, at 6 AM until 12 PM on April 22, 2024. Set-up would occur over four days and would occur from 6 AM until 10 PM on April 17-18, 2024, from 6 AM until 6 PM on April 19, 2024, and from 6 AM until 11:55 PM on April 20, 2024. Day 1 of the event would occur on April 19, 2024, from 6 PM to 10:30 PM, day 2 on April 21, 2024, from 8 AM until 4:30 PM. Dismantling would occur on April 21, 2024, from 4 PM until 11:55 PM, and on April 22, 2024, from 6 AM until 12 PM. Sound amplification from entertainment would occur from 9 AM until 10 PM on April 19, 2024, and from 9 AM until 4 PM on April 21, 2024. Ellen Browning Scripps Park would be closed to the public from 6 AM on April 17, 2024, through 12 PM on April 22, 2024.

Street parking would be closed for public parking on the following streets:

Coast Boulevard between Cove to Ocean Street (west side) from 6 AM on April 17, 2024, until 10 PM on April 21, 2024. Cuvier Street between Prospect and the School from 6 AM on April 19, 2024, until 10 PM on April 21, 2024. On April 20, 2024, Herschel Street between Prospect and Wall Street, and Prospect between Girard and Cave Street (east side). On April 21, 2024, from 3 AM until 8 PM, Coast Boulevard between Cove and Ocean (east side), Coast Boulevard between Cave Street and the Cove, Girard Avenue between Coast Boulevard and Prospect Street, Herschel Street (south side) between Prospect Street and Wall Street for ADA parking. Ivanhoe Avenue between Prospect and Cave Streets from 4 AM until 9 AM on April 21, 2024.

Road closures associated with this event would occur on April 21, 2024, from 2 AM until 8 PM on Coast Boulevard between Prospect Street and Girard Avenue, on Girard Avenue between Coast Boulevard and Prospect Street. Ivanhoe Avenue between Prospect Street and Cave Street from 4 AM to 9 AM. Coast Boulevard would be closed to thru traffic except for business and residents from 2 AM until 8 PM on April 21, 2024.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

The completed appeal form shall include the required appeal fee, with a check payable to: City Treasurer.
