NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit - North Park Salsa Fest

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: North Park

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 3

LOCATION: North Park Mini Park, 3812 29th Street

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a salsa tasting at the North Park Mini Park located at 3812 29th Street, on 29th Street and North Park Way, on April 20, 2024. The event would include a beer garden, live performances, activities for kids, tents, inflatable bounce house, sound amplification, fencing and/or barricades, food preparation, food sampling, food trucks, beverages, tables, chairs, portable restrooms, and recycling and trash containers. Sound amplification from performances would occur from 11:30 AM until 4:30 PM. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 7 AM to 7 PM on April 20, 2024. Set-up would occur from 7 AM to 11:30 AM, the event would occur from 11:30 AM to 4:30 PM and clean-up/dismantling would occur from 4:30 PM to 7 PM.

There would be road and parking closures associated with the event and would occur on April 20, 2024, from 7 AM until 6 PM, and would include Granada Street from North Park Way to University Avenue, 29th Street between North Park Way and University Avenue. Then only the west half of the street would be closed from the entrance/exit of the North Park Garage to the southern end of The Observatory Building. See site map for details.
