## Item 8: Presentation by the City Attorney of an Ethics Reform Proposal to Amend Laws Governing the Ethics Commission in the Municipal Code and Charter.

This item has been placed on the agenda at the City Attorney's request for discussion and possible action. The item may return to the Commission for specific action at future meetings.

The City Attorney will present a proposed ethics reform package, which she has requested to present to the City Council's Rules Committee. (For background, see City Attorney Memorandum MS-2023-8, dated September 20, 2023.) The proposals would update certain of the Commission's procedural and enforcement laws by amending the San Diego Municipal Code (Article 6, Division 4: Ethics Commission), and the City Charter (including section 41(d), Ethics Commission). Charter amendments require voter approval.

Municipal Code section 26.0414(f) empowers the Commission "To perform ongoing review of the *City's* existing *Governmental Ethics Laws* and the *Commission's* enforcement procedures, and to propose updates of those laws to the City Council for approval." The proposals are thus being brought to the Commission for discussion.
