MAY 15 | CITY COUNCIL

SIDEWALK VENDING PERMIT FEE

On May 17, 2022, City Council approved the Sidewalk Vending Permit Fee for one year and requested staff to return to Council after the first year of the program's implementation. In this one year update, city staff reported that 673 permits have been issued to vendors thus far. The permit fee was approved to continue at \$38 to balance accessibility and fairness for residents who wish to participate.

MAY 23 | CITY COUNCIL

CITY OF SAN DIEGO 2022 CRIME BRIEFING

The presentation contained several key statistics within the City of San Diego, including a substantial decrease in gang crime. City wide, gang homicide decreased by 65%, while gang shootings declined by 11%. Additionally, overall crime decreased by 7.5% and violent crime in Council District Four decreased by 9%. Council President pro Tem Montgomery Steppe issued the following statement: "The recent statistics demonstrate that our City is beginning to positively impact our youth and families by supporting in the public safety them ecosystem. We must continue investing in holistic, sustainable solutions with public safety to mitigate violence and make our City safer for everyone."

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE FALCK MOBILE HEALTH CONTRACT

Based on the dynamic demands of the City's Emergency Medical Services system, City Council voted to approve a resolution allowing a First Amendment to the Falck contract. The Amendment would require Falck to subcontract with a second San Diego-accredited ambulance transport provider to help meet the needs of public health and safety.

FY24 TOURISM MARKETING DISTRICT REPORT

On May 17, the ED&IR Committee received the Fiscal Year 2024 San Diego Tourism Marketing District Report of Activities. The SDTMD is essential in increasing hotel room night occupancy and attracting tourism activity. The report showed that funding from tourism has been restored to pre-pandemic levels, which ultimately supports our City in the Transient Occupancy Tax that funds our City budget. MAY 22 | CITY COUNCIL

APPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMISSION ON POLICE PRACTICES

On May 22, City Council made appointments to the Independent Commission on Police Practices. The Commission consists of 25 seats that will investigate reports of police misconduct. By Ordinance, the Commission comprises 9 atlarge seats, 9 District represented seats, 5 Low-and-Moderate Income Representative seats, and 2 Youth seats. Appointed Commissioners will now proceed to background checks.

MAY 24 | BUDGET & GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY COMMITTEE

WATER RATE ADJUSTMENTS, COST OF SERVICE STUDY, AND PROP 218

On May 24, the B&GE Committee heard an overview of proposed rate adjustment for the City's water rates, presented in response to the <u>Public</u> <u>Utilities Department 2022 Water Cost of Service study</u>. The purpose of this hearing was to set the public hearing date for City Council. Once the hearing date is set, a notice to the public will go forward. This request to set a public hearing will come to City Council at a later date.





COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS



City Council declared May 2023 to be Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in the City of San Diego. From the Fil-Am Seniors fellowshipping at the Bay Terrace Senior and Community Center to the parishioners' of the Market Street Lao Temple, the AAPI community is live and strong both in Council District 4 and the City. The contributions are immeasurable and I thank the AAPI community for the diversity they bring to the City. On May 20th, Council President pro Tem celebrated 38th Annual Father Joe's Villages Children's Charity to support the mission of support services for children experiencing homelessness. Father Joe's Village is committed to providing opportunities through after-school programs and Therapeutic Childcare Centers, and this type of investment for our youth gives them a true chance to succeed. Congratulations to Father Joe's for another successful event!





On May 13th, Council President pro Tem Montgomery Steppe celebrated the 40th annual Peacemaker Awards ceremony with National Conflict Resolution Center.
