COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT René McKee

After 28 years of being a champion for developing and providing financial wellness programs and community partnerships at California Coast Credit Union, René McKee retires in March. As Senior Vice President of Community and Public Relations for the credit union, as well as a founding board member of the Cal Coast Cares Foundation, René has developed and overseen the 501(c)(3) non-profit that provides scholarships for high school seniors, foster students, and college students as well as grants to educators, including to students and teachers at many area schools in underresourced communities.

One of the local communities that René supports is the **San Diego Promise Zone**. She has led Cal Coast's financial inclusion initiative in the Promise Zone since 2019 and has participated in the San Diego Promise Zone Steering Committee and Economic Development Working Group to learn more about the needs of the Southeastern neighborhoods and how Cal Coast can better support its residents and small businesses.

"Rene's dedication to financial inclusion spans her entire career. She spearheaded the establishment of our foundation, which has awarded over \$1 million in scholarships and grants since its inception in 2015. Her efforts have had a major impact in our community and I'm happy her work will live on through Cal Coast's efforts in the Promise Zone," stated Robert Scheid, Sr. Director, Community & Public Relations.



In learning that some of the communities in the Promise Zone were void of financial institutions, which leads to many residents falling victim to the exorbitant fees charged by check cashing and payday loan outlets, René and the Cal Coast leadership team created a financial wellness center in partnership with Logan Heights CDC to provide financial education, access, and resources for these neighborhoods.

In addition to the creation of financial opportunities for individuals, René led the development of a partnership with the City of San Diego, which in part has included awarding over \$180,000 in grants to date to Promise Zone nonprofits for capacity building, workforce development, and support of their other vital programs. Thus far, 15 nonprofits have received grant funding to help create or sustain programming which directly support the community.

When asked about her **dream for the Promise Zone**, René stated that it's for residents "to have equal access to economic and educational opportunities, to be financially secure, and able to live healthy, happy, and fulfilling lives." When she retires, she plans to "volunteer with one of the amazing Promise Zone non-profits I have had the honor of partnering with!"

<u>Home Depot Foundation: Veteran Housing</u> <u>Grants Program</u>

The Home Depot Foundation's Veteran Housing Grants Program provides support throughout the United States, including Puerto Rico, for the new construction or rehabilitation of multifamily, permanent, supportive housing for veterans. The grants fund physical construction costs and must comprise less than 50% of the total development cost of the project. Rural areas will be considered, but priority will be given to large cities, defined as populations over 300,000 people. Nonprofit organizations with a current operating budget of at least \$300,000, with previous experience developing veteran housing, and that currently manage or own veteran-specific housing are eligible to apply. **Application deadlines: March 22, 2024**



Voices for Healthy Kids: Policy Campaign Grants

Voices for Healthy Kids, an initiative of the American Heart Association, works around the country to improve or create equitable policies that will make the places kids live, learn, and play healthier. Voices for Healthy Kids funds coordinated tribal, state, and local public policy issue advocacy campaigns with a focus on health equity. The 2024 Policy Campaign funding opportunity funds campaigns for public policy change in Voices for Healthy Kids' priority areas, including early care and education access, Early Head Start/Head Start appropriations, paid family and medical leave, healthy school meals expansion, sugary drink tax and investment, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) access and expanded benefits, SNAP incentives and produce prescription programs, and water access in schools and communities. Funded campaigns must pursue policy through legislation, regulation, executive order, or ballot initiative. Tribes, subdivisions of a tribe, 501(c)(3) and 501(c) (4) nonprofit organizations, and organizations with a fiscal sponsor are eligible to apply. Applicants must have the ability to conduct lobbying activities. Application deadline: March 25, 2024

WES Mariam Assefa Fund: Elevating Migrant Leadership Funding Opportunity

The WES Mariam Assefa Fund, the philanthropic arm of World Education Services, is committed to building an inclusive economy that works for immigrants and refugees. The Fund's Elevating Migrant Leadership: Building Inclusive Futures Funding Opportunity seeks proposals from organizations in the United States that are elevating the voices and leadership of immigrants and refugees. Support will be provided to organizations that work with immigrants and refugees who are seeking to develop civic leadership and advocacy skills so they can more effectively influence the development of programs and policies that affect them and their communities. Supported programs must focus on two out of three of the following areas: narrative building, experiential learning, and mentorship. Selected awardees will receive \$100,000 grants and have access to peerlearning, capacity building, and other programming. Nonprofit organizations in the U.S., or organizations with a fiscal sponsor, that have a mission and vision explicitly focused on serving immigrants and refugees and have an operating budget equal to or less than \$3 million are eligible to apply.

Classics for Kids Foundation

The mission of Classics for Kids Foundation is to empower young people to shape positive futures through music, build sustainable stringed instrument music programs, and provide grants for high-quality instruments. The Foundation provides matching grants to schools and nonprofit organizations serving children kindergarten through grade 12 in the United States, with a focus on at-risk and rural youth. The grants support up to 50% of the total cost to purchase fine stringed instruments, including those from the violin family, guitars, and ukuleles.

Specialty Dental Clinic Grant Program

The primary goal of the UAIP projects is to support the development of urban agriculture and innovative production. In 2016, the San Diego Promise Zone became one of 22 federally designated Promise Zones in the United States and one of only four in California. The San Diego Promise Zone covers a 6.4-square-mile targeted area with more than 80,000 residents that spans East Village and Barrio Logan east to Encanto. It is home to the City's most culturally rich and ethnically diverse neighborhoods, but also some of the most underresourced communities. Through the Promise Zone initiative, community-based organizations, direct service providers, residents, and business owners work with government agencies to enhance collective impact, streamline resources, and deliver comprehensive support.

Since 2016, the unemployment rate has decreased from 14.9% to 6.7%, and the poverty rate has fallen from 38.3% to now 22.1% (ACS, 2016, 2021). We recognize there are many factors that contribute to these numbers. We do know that in the 7 years since the designation, targeted efforts based organizations have supported some improvement in these areas, however, we recognize there is still plenty of work to do to continue improving the lives of our Promise Zone residents.
