CALL TO ORDER:

• Mr. Frichtel called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES: For January 9th, 2024

• The minutes were approved. (Jeff Stevens/Fay Hamilton)

Discussion Item:

- 101. Councilmember Kent Lee D6 Discussion of Mira Mesa Community Parks
 - 1. Mira Mesa does not have enough park space to meet demand. More recreational space to serve families and youth are needed.
 - 2. Mira Mesa Community Parks Phase 2 project has been waiting for funding since 2005, it's still awaiting confirmation.
 - a. A bid went out last summer, but there were fewer bids than expected. However there have been more responses from contractors recently, there have been requests for an extension for future bids.
 - b. They are hopeful for qualified and competitive bids.
 - c. The deadline currently is March 7th 2024
 - 3. Some current projects that are in the works:
 - a. A new aquatic center with 2 pools.
 - b. Renovations to existing rec centers such as fixing dry rot and wood damage.
 - c. A new park being built by 3Roots
 - d. The completion of Carroll Canyon Road.
 - e. Completion of the Wangenheim field project after several delays.
 - 4. Some questions from the public:
 - a. Someone asked if there's too much priority over basketball and baseball, and not enough priority for sports like badminton, or pickleball.
 - b. Someone also asked why the Wangenheim field has taken so long to be completed, it's delays have caused tournaments to be canceled, leading to loss of revenue.
 - i. Kevin Oliver from Engineering and Capitol projects explains that there were challenges and delays due to 70 days of rain and storm water regulations slowing down progress. A lot of other projects have been impacted such as road repair and the completion of Jonas Salk Park.
 - c. There was a question about if there could be a new performing arts center in Mira Mesa.
 - i. Kent Lee explained that project is unlikely due to a new performing arts center being perceived as being competition for the high school.

NON-AGENDA PUBLIC COMMENT: This portion of the agenda provides an opportunity for members of the public to address the Community Recreation Group Board on items of interest within the jurisdiction of the Board. Limited to items not on the agenda and three minutes.

- Vincent Alvarez informs the council that there are unauthorized Tennis lessons going on at Hourglass.
 - Vincent states that these Tennis coaches are taking up space that the public could use, and they are responding to concerns with bullying and intimidation.
 - Vincent informed Parks and Recreation staff to talk with the coaches, but they told Vincent to inform the police.

- The police couldn't do anything either since there apparently isn't any municipal code that would prevent what the Tennis Coaches are doing.
- Vincent passed out flyers for a website to spread awareness of what the Tennis Coaches are doing.
