


Value of Street Trees:

STREET TREE SPECIES: BAUHINIA VARIEGATA. (PURPLE ORCHID TREE)



STREET TREE SPECIES: LIQUIDAMBAR STYRACIFLUA (SWEETGUM)


Community Benefits: Mature street trees benefit the entire community, not just individual property owners. These benefits may include:






Inclusive Preservation:
