

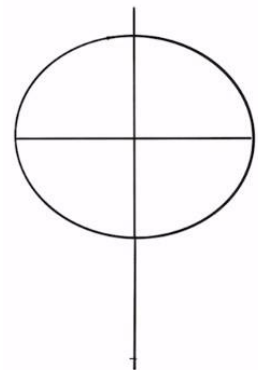
# How To Draw Barbie (Margot Robbie version)

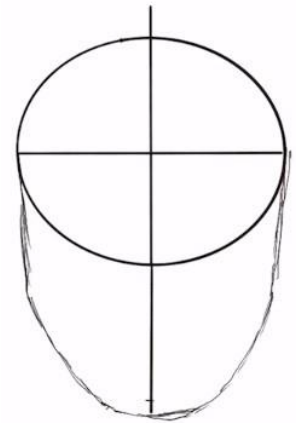
### Materials:

- 1 white 8 1/2 x 11 cardstock or any white drawing paper
  - 1 HB #2 pencil
  - 1 Hi-polymer eraser OR 1 Clic Eraser - Pentel brand recommended for both.
  - (OPTIONAL) Colored pencils or crayons - 1 peach, 1 yellow, 1 blue, 1 pink, 1 dark pink, 1 brown
  - (OPTIONAL) 1 Pigma Micron black archival ink pen size 08 or any fine-tipped black felt pen
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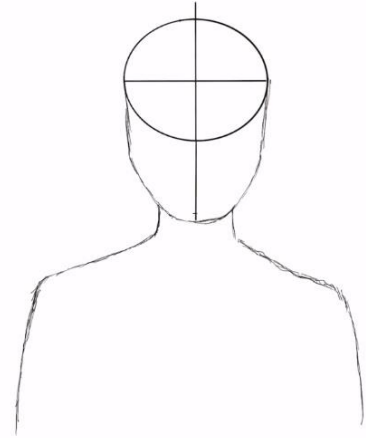
With your pencil, lightly draw a circle. Add a horizontal and vertical line through the middle of the circle. Measure the distance of the vertical line from the top to the bottom of the circle. Extend the vertical line by this distance past the bottom of the circle. This will determine the placement of the chin. Make sure to draw these guidelines lightly. We will erase them later.



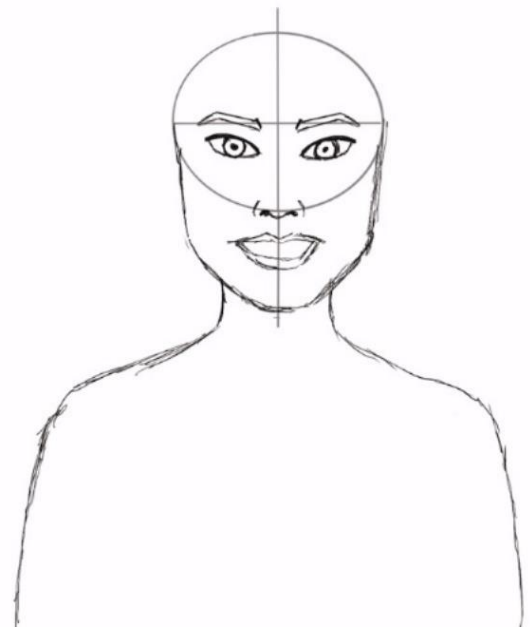
Draw the face outlines with two diagonal or slightly curved lines directly below the horizontal line. These lines will converge toward the vertical line. Stop the lines once they are slightly below the circle. At the bottom of the vertical line, draw a flat 'U' shape. At the bottom of each line, draw curved lines converging towards the flat 'U.' Connect the two lines to the flat 'U' shape.



Draw the neck with two curved lines attached to the flat 'U' shape. Attach a diagonal line to each curve. These lines represent the shoulders. Draw a curved line at the end of each diagonal. The curved line will then angle downward to complete the arms.



Draw the eyebrows with a series of interconnected diagonal lines. Position the eyebrows on the horizontal line. Use interconnected curved lines to draw almond shaped eyes. Eyelashes can be suggested by darkening the top section of the eyes. Because our character is looking forward, the irises and pupils will be drawn as whole circles.



Draw a small, flat 'U' shape near the bottom of the circle for the nose. Attach two tear drop shapes to each side, and bracket those with two smaller curved shapes on either side.

To draw the upper lip, draw a flat 'M' shape. Immediately below, draw another flat 'M' shape. Draw the bottom lip with two flat 'U' shapes. Connect the bottom to the top lip with diagonal lines.



Two draw the hair, draw a series of interconnected 's' shapes. You will position them above the top of the circle. The 's' shapes are bangs.

Above them, draw a flat, upside-down 'U.' Connected to the upside-down 'U' are a series of longer 's' shapes for the outline of the hair.



Draw two vertical lines downward from the left shoulder. Draw a flat 'U' shape for the neckline of the dress. Draw a modified upside-down 'L' for the left side of the dress. Draw a vertical curved line for the right side of the dress.

Add ears - You will draw the ears slightly below the eyes. Draw a 'J' on the right side of the face, and a backwards 'J' on the left.

You have now completed your initial sketch. Next, erase all guidelines. Make any necessary corrections before you ink or color your drawing.



It is your choice how to complete this project. Some possibilities are shown below.
