APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- 2. City Council District 9 Representative Sara Al-Agha reported she had a constituent contact her regarding how gates were closed to the ballfield. She communicated with the Parks department and are coordinating with the Adams Elementary School to keep the doors open on scheduled hours. She mentioned their office is dedicated to having a clean, safe, and healthy community. She believes that safe walkable streets that are the cornerstone which provides accessibility for everyone. Her office is working on policy changes and has a survey for opinion on street conditions. The transportation department plans to be in District 9 to service streetlights in June and July. She said she is finalizing the dates for the Budget Forum

Regarding the Ward Canyon Park GDP, a city project team is working with the park planners to evaluate areas of the existing park property and where to locate the dog park. She mentioned that the city is reconsidering the option of Cal Trans' relinquishment due to cost and time impacts to the Ward Canyon Park project of constructing the I-15 on off rams required. She says there will be a community engagement process for layouts of the dog park, new recreation building, and park amenities, after they get started with proposed improvements. The date for the community engagement process has yet to be announced. The expected demolition of the vacant building at 49th and Adams Avenue is to happen Fall of 2024 – 8 to 10 months from now.
