University City Plan Update

At the end of July, the City Council unanimously approved a long-awaited update to the University Community Plan, concluding a six-year public process that resulted in a new blueprint to create more capacity for homes, jobs, and public amenities in the area — with a particular focus on growth opportunities in the North UC/UTC/Torrey Pines corridors.

The community is one of the region's most critical hubs for innovation, transportation, and our regional economy — serving as home to UCSD, many life science institutions, and several stops on the recent \$2 billion Blue Line trolley expansion.

Ahead of the final vote, I also secured a requirement for an updated and more thorough traffic analysis prior to the implementation of any traffic calming measures on Governor Dr. This future analysis would specifically keep school impacts during peak-period traffic patterns in mind and would help the City use the latest data when evaluating much-needed improvements to promote safer streets.

As we now work to implement the plan, I am committed to working with you to ensure the City delivers on necessary community infrastructure, improved parks and open space, and additional affordable housing as part of our long-term vision for the University Community.

Mira Mesa Community Park and Epicentre Updates

Exciting news for our community! The City Council has approved a \$43.3 million investment to upgrade and add new amenities to Mira Mesa Community Park. The "Phase II" project, long envisioned by the local community since 2005, includes a rec center renovation, a new aquatic center, an all-wheel park, basketball courts, playgrounds, and more. Construction is set to begin this summer and finish by Summer 2026.

In another significant development, the County Board of Supervisors has unanimously approved the lease agreement for the Mira Mesa Epicentre. This revitalization project,

supported by Supervisor Lawson-Remer and me, follows years of community input and an inspiring day of advocacy from local youths. These projects mark significant milestones in enhancing our community spaces and activities.

One Year of the Mattress Recycling Program

After one year, the City of San Diego is celebrating the success of its Mattress Recycling Program in helping divert items from the landfill. Over the past year, more than 14,000 unwanted mattresses and box springs have been diverted. Illegal dumping of these bulky items has decreased by 34%.

San Diegans can drop off unwanted mattresses and box springs for free, Monday through Friday at the City's Mattress Collection Site just outside the Miramar Landfill entrance. More information is available at RecyclingWorks.com
