## **DEPARTMENT PROCEDURE AFFECTED:** DP 3.02

Portions of this document are deemed by the San Diego Police Department to be records of security procedures and are exempt from disclosure under the California Public Records Act (CPRA), Government Code Section 7923.600 or are deemed by the San Diego Police Department to be exempt from public disclosure because the public interest served by not disclosing the information clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure, pursuant to California Government Code section 7922.000.

The Traffic Division Investigation Unit (TIU) and Traffic Special Investigations (TSI) routinely collect cell phones, recording devices, tablets, and computers for evidence in nearly all felony collision and specialized traffic-related investigations. Changing technology, encryption, and the ability to clear a phone's memory off-site requires the investigator to block cellular, Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, RFI, and GPS signals.

Preserving data is critical for these investigations, and several steps are required to prevent a possible data wipe. Due to the high volume of electronic devices seized by Traffic Division Investigators and the limited charging storage space at Headquarters (HQ), the Traffic Division has acquired a charging Faraday Locker (identical to the locker at the HQ Property Room) to reduce the utilization of the available storage space at Headquarters. (See <u>Department Order</u> 23-13 for further details on how to use the Faraday locker.)

The Traffic Division Mobile Device Locker is located at the (**Deleted – records of security**) Property Room, (**Deleted – records of security**), San Diego, and is <u>only</u> for SDPD Traffic Division Investigations.

All electronic devices impounded and stored in the Faraday Locker at the (**Deleted – records of security**) Property Room are pending warrant approvals. Once the Search Warrant has been approved, the

electronic device will be removed from the Faraday Locker and processed in accordance with DP 3.02.

All non-traffic evidentiary mobile devices needing data preservation must use the Mobile **Device Locker in the SDPD HQ Property Room.** The Crime Laboratory will not remove devices from the Faraday Locker located at the (**Deleted – records of security**).

If an exceptional need arises for an investigator from another unit to utilize storage space in the Faraday Locker at Eastern Division, the Detective Sergeant from the Traffic Division Traffic Investigations Unit (TIU) or Traffic Special Investigations (TSI) may grant permission for temporary storage until it can be transferred to HQ at the earliest time possible.
