

Kumeyaay Lake Campground

lies in the middle of more than 8,000 acres of chaparral, oak woodlands, mountains, and grasslands that make up Mission Trails Regional Park, the largest Open Space Park owned and managed by the City of San Diego Park and Recreation Department.

Nestled beside Kumeyaay Lake, the quaint campground offers something for everyone, fishing and more than 60 miles of trails for hiking, mountain biking, and horseback riding. Located only 20 minutes from downtown San Diego, the campground and the trails which surround it offer people of all ages and abilities the chance to visit peacefully with the birds, reptiles, and animals that call Mission Trails Regional Park home.

Mission Trails' award-winning Visitor and Interpretive Center is located only 2 miles away from the Campground. A national historic landmark, Old Mission Dam, and Cowles Mountain, the highest peak in San Diego, are also nearby.

City Park Rangers and volunteers are available year round to lead activities such as interpretive walks, wildlife lectures, and nature photography classes, adding even more to the Kumeyaay Lake Campground experience. How to Get Here

From Route 52: Take 52 east to the Mast Blvd. exit in Santee. Turn left on Mast Blvd., go under the freeway overpass to the first traffic signal, West Hills Parkway, and turn right. Take West Hills Parkway to Mission Gorge Road and turn right. Proceed to the right turn road that occurs just prior to the traffic signal at Father Junipero Serra Trail and turn right. Continue .2 mile. Kumeyaay Lake Campground is on your right.

From Interstate 8: Take 8 to Mission Gorge Fairmont Ave. exit. Turn north onto Mission Gorge Road. Proceed approximately 6 miles to the second Father Junipero Serra Trail entrance at the signal light and turn left. (Note: this is about 2 miles past the Visitor Center entrance between Jackson Drive and Golfcrest Drive.) Drive .2 miles to Kumeyaay Lake Campground on your right.

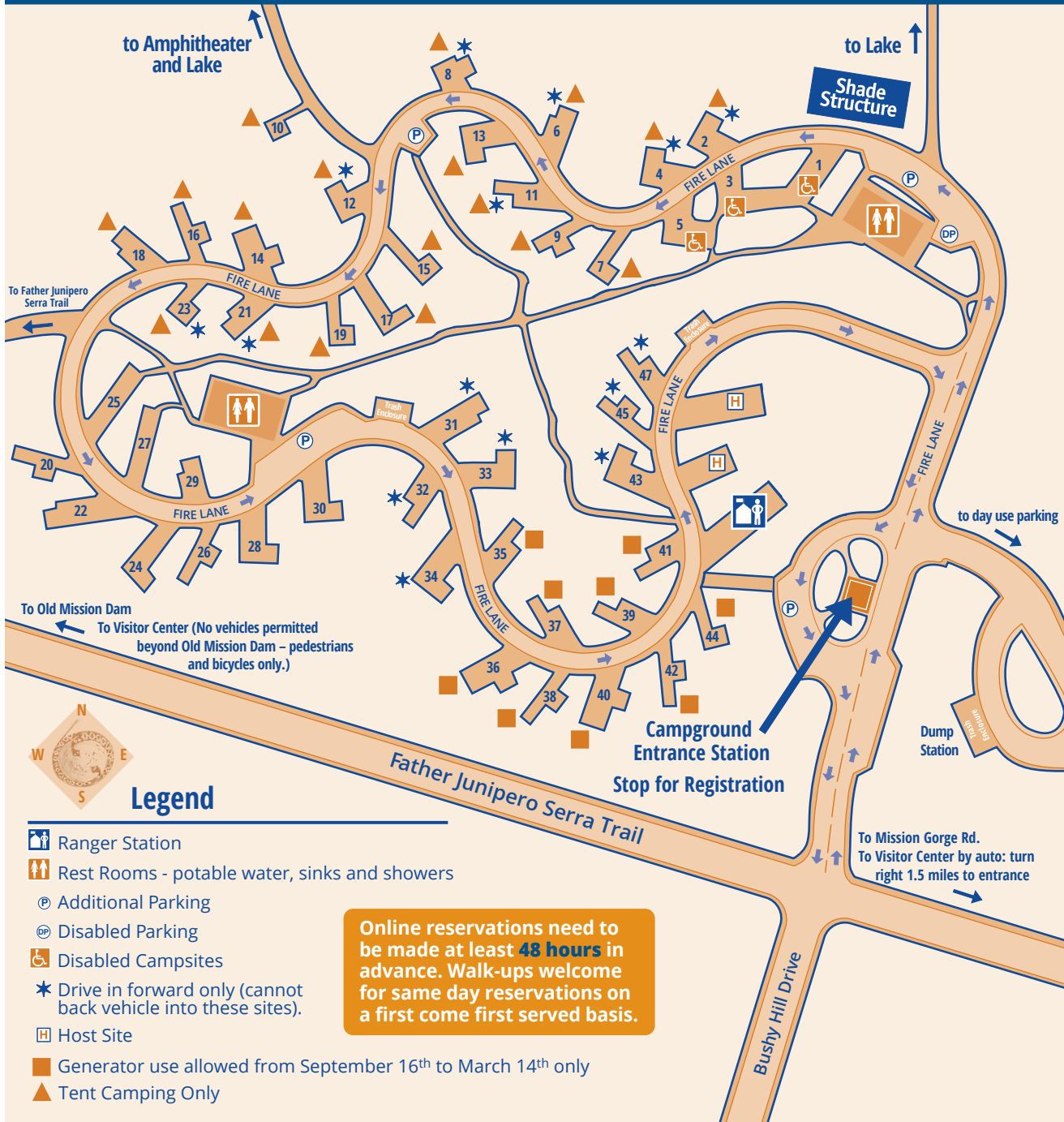

Rules & Regulations

Check in time begins at 2 p.m. Check out is 12 p.m. No early or late check out available. Limit of 6 persons per site.

Alcoholic Beverages, Glass Containers, and Smoking are Prohibited this prohibition extends throughout the Park.

Refund Policy

To obtain a refund all reservations must be canceled 14 days in advance with the submitted Refund form. No refunds for late cancellations.

Pets are Welcome! Please keep your pet leashed at all times. Please clean up after your pet.

Vehicles must be parked within designated areas; extra overnight vehicles are \$4.14. Speed limit in the Campground is 5mph.

Trash must be placed in the proper receptacles; please place recyclables in the proper containers.

Food should not be left unattended at any time; please secure it in your vehicle.

Campfires are permitted in designated fire pits only; no treated wood, pallets, construction wood, or gathering of park materials is allowed.

Wildlife and Plant Life should not be disturbed in any way; do not feed wildlife, do not attach anything to any plants or trees, and please stay on designated trails.

Generator Use is only permitted in designated Generator Sites between the hours of 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. from September 16th to March 14 . There is no generator use permitted out-of-season or out of the designated sites.

Fishing is permitted from sunrise to sunset. All persons over the age of 16 must have a valid fishing license.

Weapons and protective devices of any kind are prohibited in the Campground and throughout the Park.

More detailed information is available in the Entry Station.

You are ultimately responsible for knowing and complying with all Park Rules and Regulations.
