Deacidification with non-aqueously with Magnesium Oxide



Paper mending and Guarded sections with Japanese paper with starch paste



Resewn link stitch through existing holes



Rebound in green bookcloth, acid free endpapers and gold foil lettering on spine and front

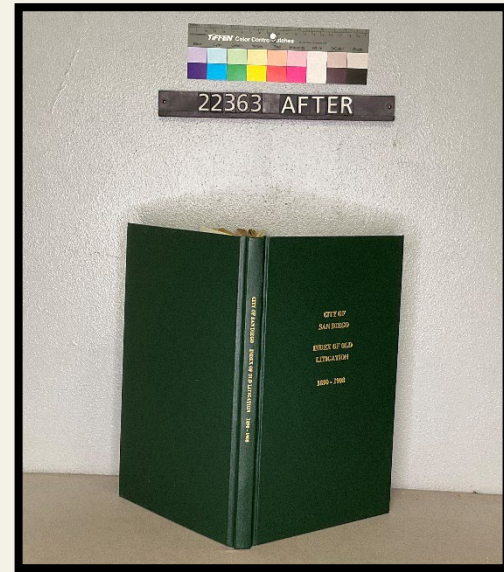


City of San Diego, Index of Old Litigation (1890-1908)

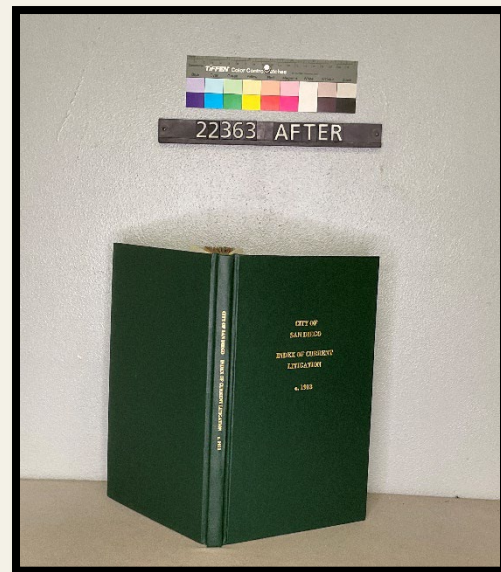

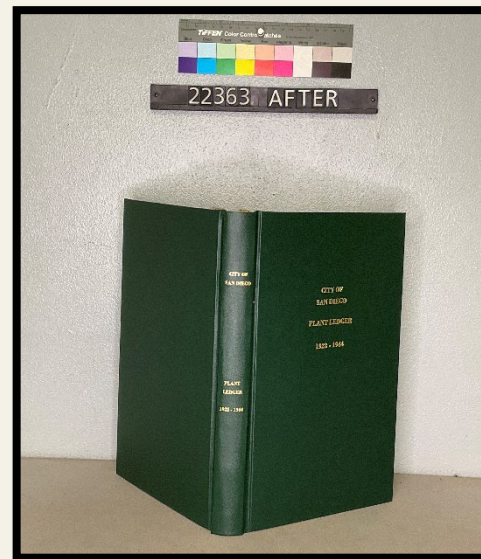

Specifies various plants that were cultivated throughout the City, including Presidio Park, Balboa Park, Roseville, Civic Center, Navy Hospital, etc., Plants, seeds and bulbs that were received by the nursery, also details plants that were sold, shipping information, paid subscriptions, salaries, stationery and office supplies, telephone and telegraph and United States Department of Agriculture regarding plants that were received from Glendale, California and Riverside, California equipment station.

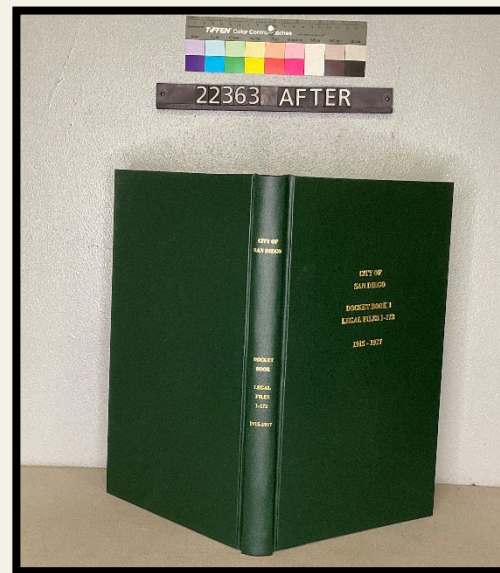

Litigation matters of various individuals and groups. Some of the names mentioned, Mayor John L. Bacon (1921-1927).



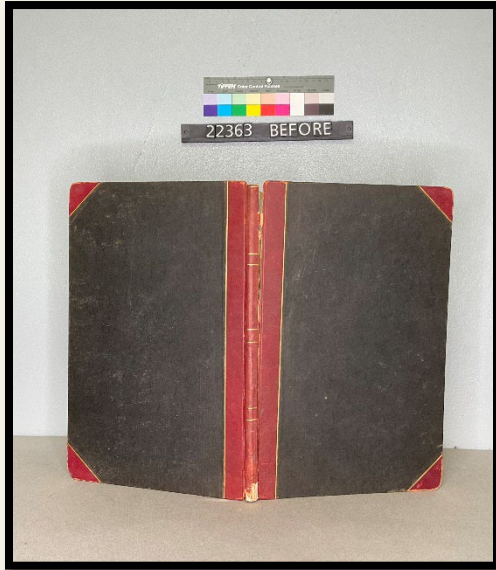

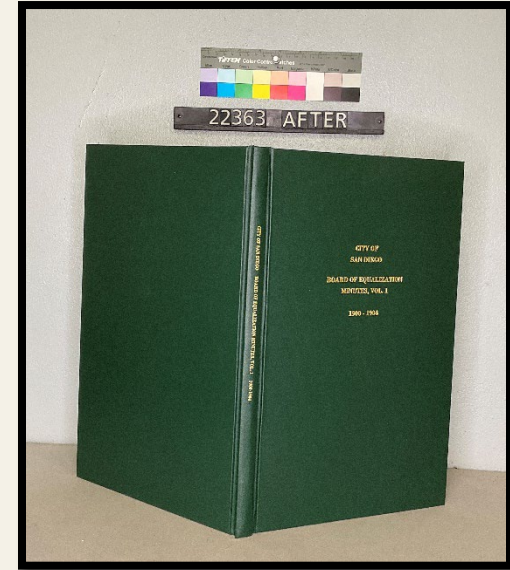

Board of Equalization Minute book details Board proceedings and motions; complaints respecting the valuation of property as fixed by the assessor.



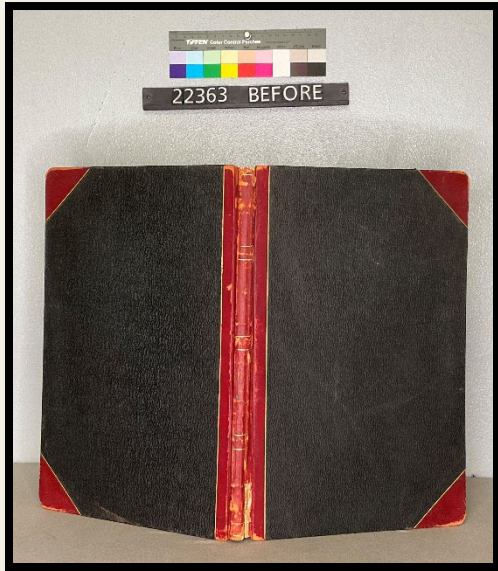
