Donald Trump, in his official capacity as President of the United States, et al., Defendants-Appellants.</i></p> <p>The City of San Diego joined an amicus brief on behalf of city and local governments, in support of several state Attorneys General, including California's, in litigation challenging the Trump Administration's attempt to end birthright citizenship in the executive order, titled "Protecting the Meaning and Value of American Citizenship," which aims to eliminate birthright citizenship, a principle established by the 14th Amendment, that grants American citizenship to children born "in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof." This brief argues the executive order defies the U.S. Constitution and contradicts core American values, warns of immediate negative impacts on local governments and their communities, including administrative confusion, reduced access to federally funded health care and educational services, and that many local governments will be forced to provide such services directly, further draining already scant local resources.</p>	<p>Jonathan B.
