

## LEGIBLE GRAFFITI How-To-Festival 2025 Activity Kit

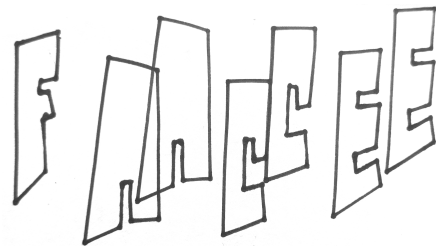
### How to Fix A Flat letter ... The LEGIBLE GRAFFITI way.

Use this activity booklet to practice three dimensional lettering on the following pages.

The supplies that I use for Legible Graffiti are a lightboard (or window: some clear surface that would enable seeing through various kinds of paper), markers (or other multicolored pencils, pens, or crayons) to draw with, and paper (lots and lots of paper). I use blank "copy" paper that you can find at most supply stores like Dollar Tree, Michaels, Staples, or on Amazon.

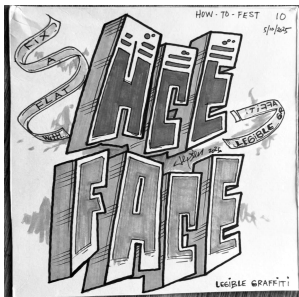
#### SUPPLIES LIST:

1. A piece of Paper (Something to put your drawing on)
2. A Pencil/Marker (Something to write/draw with)
3. A Drawing Surface (like a table, used book or clipboard)
4. A Ruler (to keep your lines straight)



#### LEGIBLE GRAFFITI "Fix A Flat" Steps

- |           |   |
|-----------|---|
| 1. Flat   | Start with a flat letter ... and copy it. |
| 2. Angle  | Move copy letter in any direction         |
| 3. Corner | Connect the corners.                      |
| 4. Edge   | Follow outer edge of letter               |
| 5. Color  | Add colors                                |
| 6. Detail | Add details                               |



At the beginning of the video demonstration, there are two completed LG 3D illustrated examples showing on my drafting table top. I may have forgotten to mention them in the video, so here they are again.



A partially Green (with bubbles) LG, and a Blue and Purple LG with a shadow, and matching bubbles around it. Those two designs showcase all six steps (1. Flat, 2. Angle, 3. Corner, 4. Edge, 5. Color, 6. Detail).

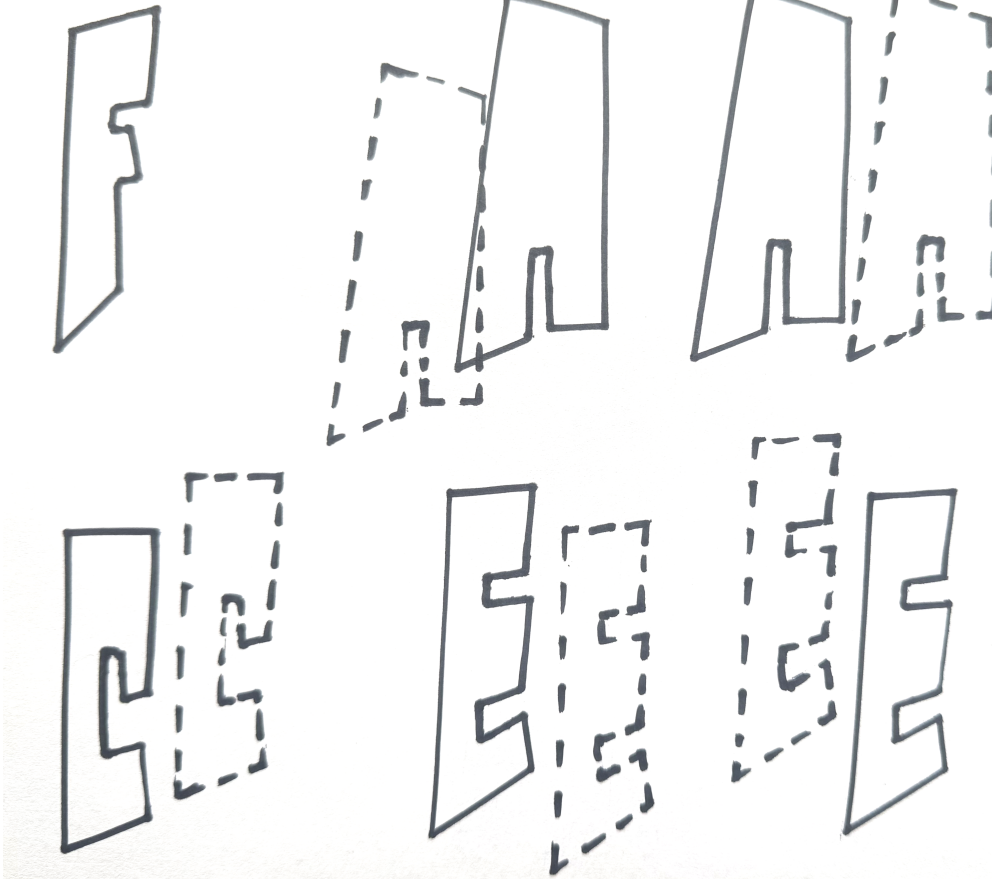
They are included here ... but in grayscale.

While making original drawings, letters, numbers, and symbols can be created on any sized paper ... practicing "Legible Graffiti" using half sheets, or quarter sheets of paper for making a twin (the two-step) of the original design to work into three dimensional (3D) drawings will save paper.

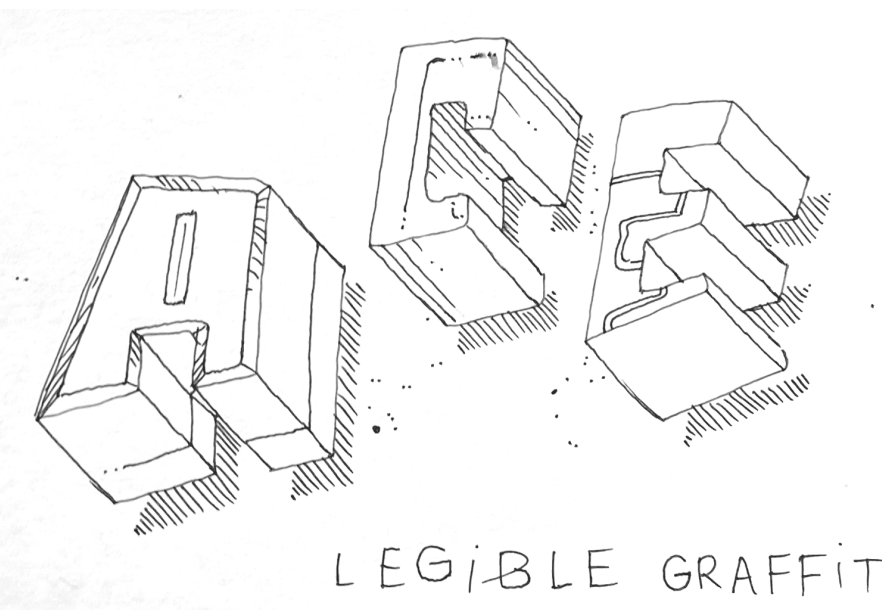
2D: Two dimensional (flat shape, letter, number or symbol ... has a length and a width).

3D: Three dimensional (not a flat shape. Has a length, a width, and a thickness of some kind).

F.A.C.E

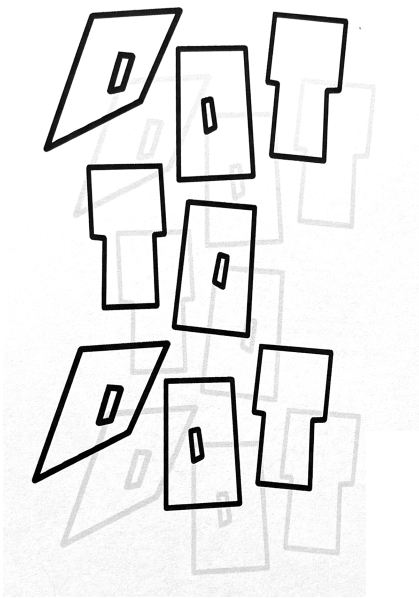


FACE is the first four steps of simple Legible Graffiti. Go ahead and finish these potential 3D letters.

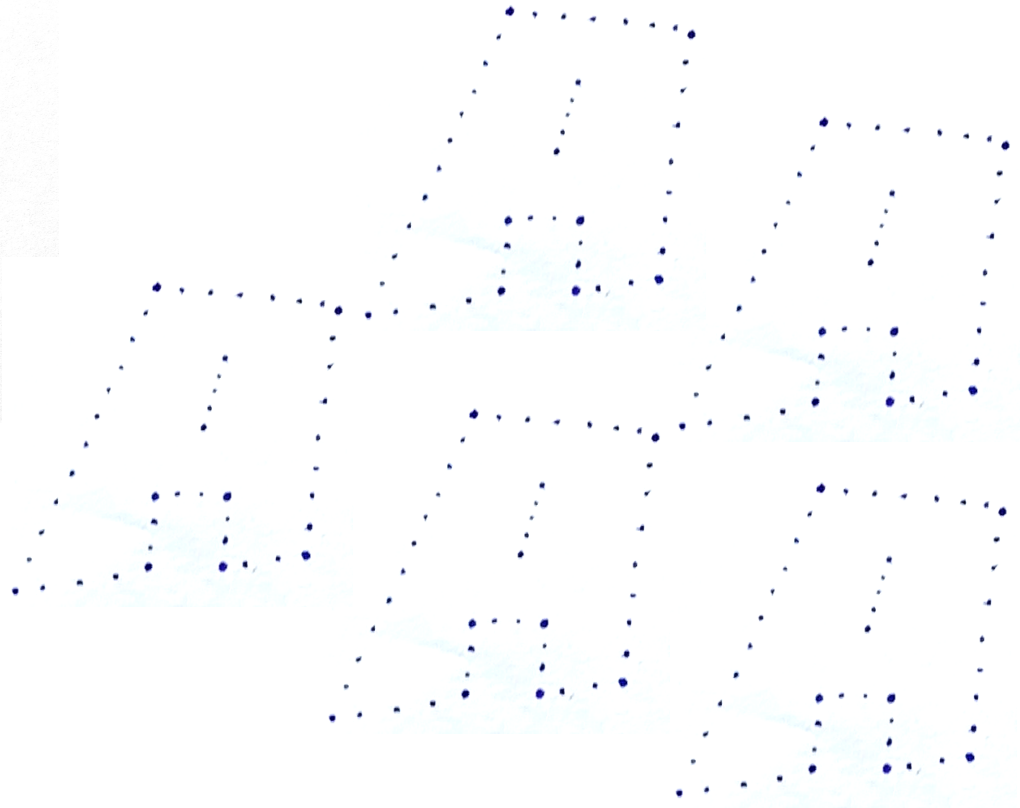


Have fun coloring this 3D ACE design.

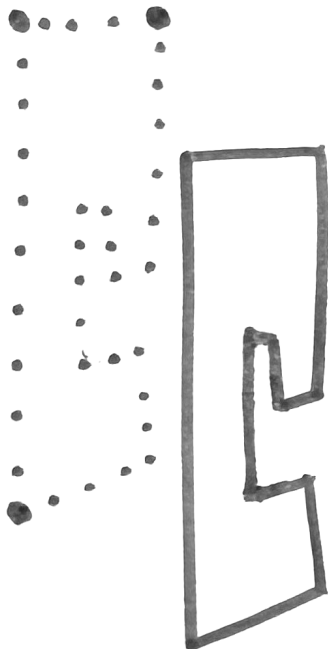




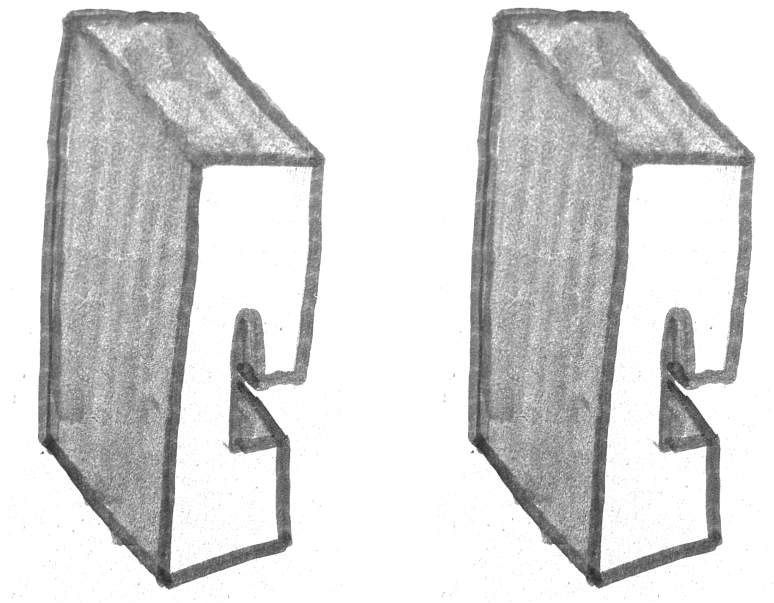
Legible Graffiti is kind of like creating a 3D dot-to-dot. It is easier with lines, instead of just dots.



Time to connect the dots and make some 3D A blocks. Have fun playing with the angles.



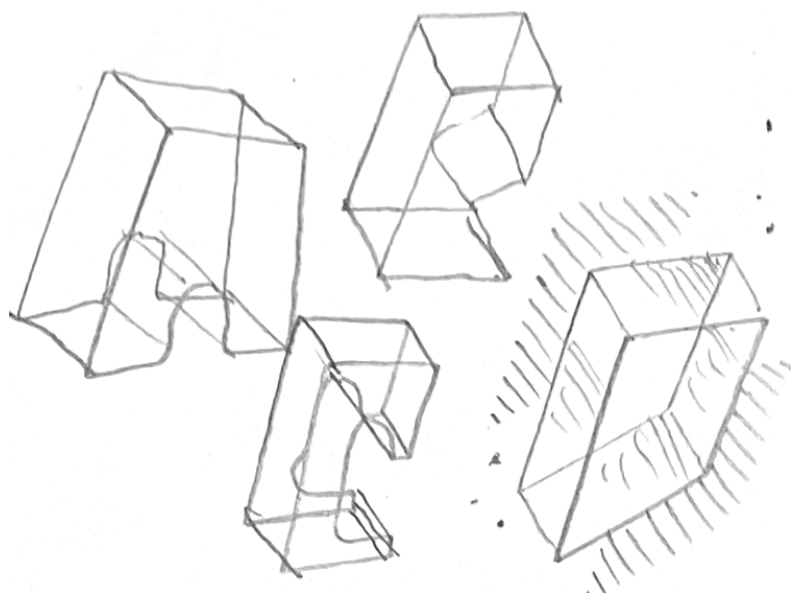
Using the Fix-A-Flat FACE steps, complete this letter C in 3D.

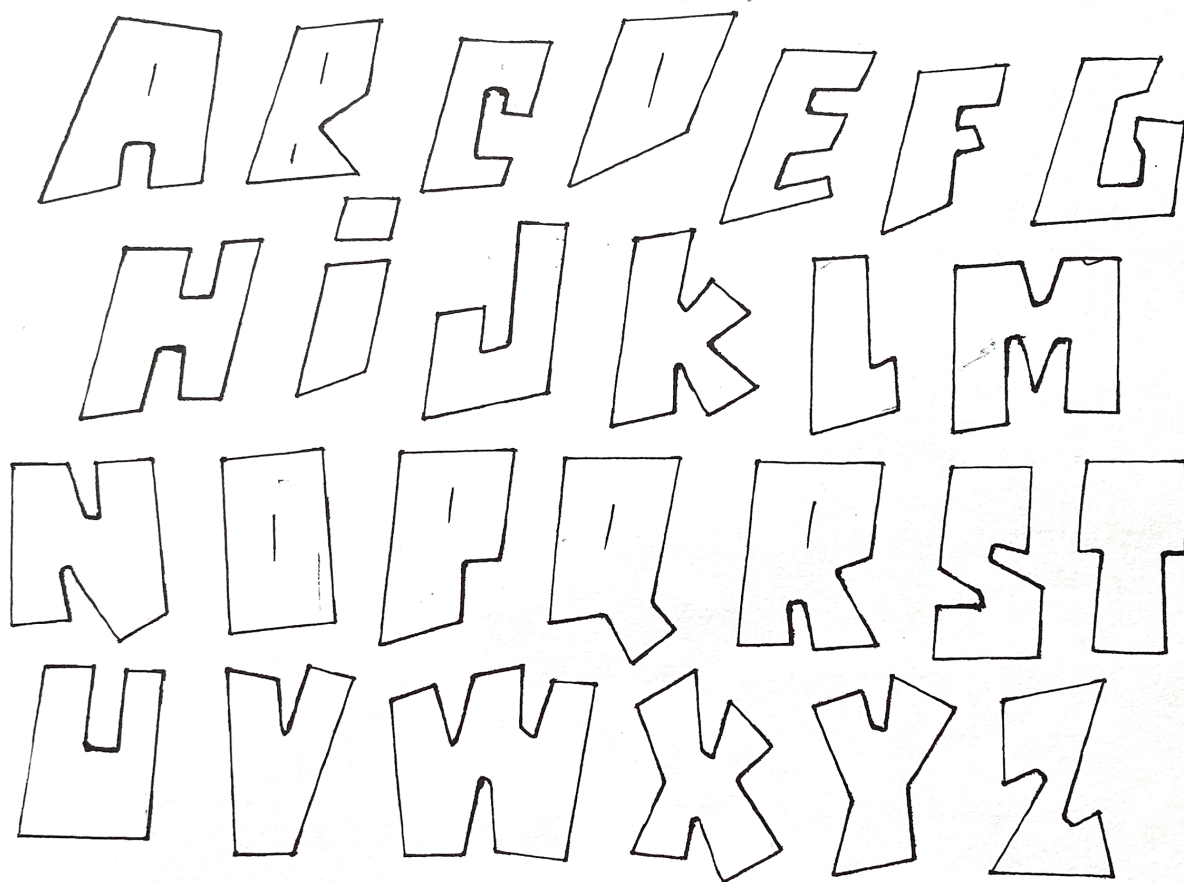




Simple Flat Stick

Legible Graffiti begins with a (2D) two dimensional design, and becomes a (3D) three dimensional masterpiece.

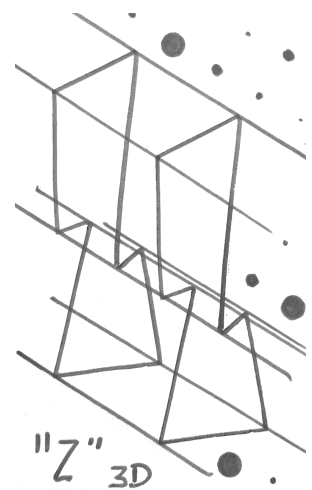
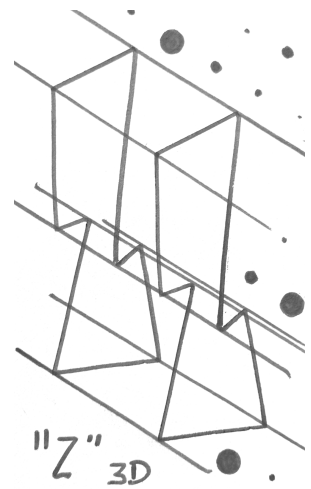
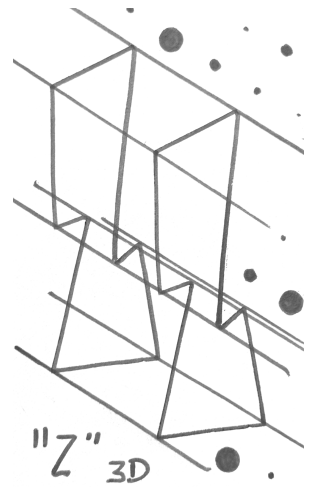


Flat Block Letter Alphabet

This page shows the front and backside of my clipboard. To complete these hollow looking letters, I could connect all the corners of each letter by drawing through them. The end result would be lettering that looks like ice cubes (see thru). If you try this yourself, I would recommend doing one letter at a time.

Practice: Go ahead and color each letter Z, differently.



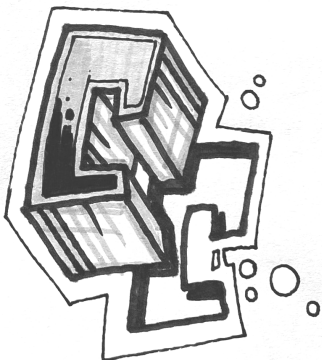
