# ASSET MANAGEMENT

### P&R Role in Developing Nature Exploration Areas

Children today spend less time outdoors than ever before, with studies showing an average of just four minutes per day in unstructured outdoor play. Recognizing the importance of reconnecting youth with nature, the City of San Diego's Parks and Recreation Department has taken an innovative approach - designing and building Nature Exploration Areas (NEAs) in our parks.



Developed entirely in-house, with bare bone budgets (typically under \$10K), NEAs are made possible through teamwork across the department - Operations, Support Services, and Asset Management. In 2016, the first pilot NEA was built in Morley Field with sustainability and accessibility in mind, utilizing repurposed materials such as fallen eucalyptus logs, reclaimed boulders, and salvaged sand from decommissioned projects.

### What's Next?

Due to overwhelmingly positive feedback, the department has steadily expanded the program with NEAs at Morley Field, Golden Hill CP, Gershwin NP, and Dennis V. Allen NP, with plans to eventually integrate an NEA within each Council District. Construction of the departments newest NEA is almost complete at Marie Widman with plans to open soon. Developing future NEAs adjacent to Recreation Centers will help fulfill the goal integrating programming such as fort-building workshops, storytelling sessions, and interactive naturebased activities. NEAs placed near recreation centers allow for supervised programing and additional materials like natural clay, fabrics and twine for forts, basket-waving supplies, and even seasonal mud play days.







As we continue to shape the future of parks in San Diego, these Nature Exploration Areas serve as a testament to what can be achieved through creativity, collaboration, and a shared commitment to connecting children with the natural world.





# **AQUATICS**

### Trainings to Prepare for Summer







With the summer season upon us, the pools are preparing to have more participants in the water. Aquatics staff attended trainings to help prepare employees for the surge in pool attendance. Camp Counselor, Pool Manager, and Water Safety Instructor trainings were held this month.

The Camp Counselor training was held at City Heights on Monday, May 19<sup>th</sup>. This trainings included land and water awareness. Pool Manager training was held on Wednesday, May 21<sup>st</sup> at Tierrasanta Pool. Additionally, on Saturday, May 25<sup>th</sup> at Tierrasanta Pool, there were 25 City of San Diego staff training along with 35 other staff from around San Diego County and beyond to be Swim Instructors (Water Safety Instructors). This training was in collaboration with the San Diego County Aquatic Council, termed the WSI Blowout.

Saturday, June 7<sup>th</sup> will be the Annual All City Aquatic Staff training to prepare for summer. Kudos to the **Aquatics Team** for preparing employees to help keep the community pools a safe place to recreate this summer.


