  - a. **Action Item 1 (6:15-6:25)** Status of Louisiana Street/Madison Avenue RRFB crosswalk and traffic calming.
    - i. Background: The following consent item was adopted by the NPPC on January 21, 2025: "We respectfully request the City to expedite the installation of the approved crosswalk (Case #40300683214) with RRFB crossing Madison Avenue at the Louisiana Street intersection. Additionally, we invite the study of additional traffic calming measures at this intersection, such as stop signs or curb extensions, to reduce vehicle speeds and improve safety for all."
    - ii. Representative for District 3 Councilmember Whitburn, Logan Braydis, has reported that there is not funding available for an RRFB installation and asked whether we'd like to have a painted crosswalk and 4 way stop installed until funding becomes available.
  - b. **Information Item 1 (6:25-6:30):** The collaboration with Uptown Community Planning Group (UpCPG) on revisions for the intersection at El Cajon Boulevard, Normal Street, and Park Boulevard has resulted in a Stand Up for Safety petition by Councilmember Whitburn to gather signatures in favor of fixing this intersection.   - d. **Information Item 4 (6:40-6:50):** The new City of San Diego Mobility Master Plan was signed 22 April 2025. The Mobility Master Plan is a comprehensive, data-driven resource that the City of San Diego will use when making decisions about mobility projects

throughout the City. The Mobility Master Plan is a citywide planning document intended to support the various mobility functions of the City, from community planning and policy, to project design and engineering, to new land use and development projects, to innovative and expanded mobility options, to maintenance and everyday operations.
