

Ready, Set, Grow San Diego - Overview

- The City of San Diego received a \$10 million grant from the Forest Service, an agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, as part of the Inflation Reduction Act for a five-year tree planting program.
- The Urban Forestry Program plans to plant over 5,000 new trees and create new tree wells.
- Project includes protecting 600 trees during sidewalk repairs.
- The City will water newly planted trees for three years.

Urban Forestry Program Highlights

VISION: Grow and maintain a world-class urban forest for San Diego.

MISSION: The Urban Forestry Program plants, protects, promotes and maintains trees for livable and sustainable City of San Diego communities.

- Urban Forestry maintains over 250,000 street trees and pruning for 50,000 palms.
- The City's Climate Action Plan aims to plant 100,000 new trees.
- Urban Forestry handles 6,000 requests annually from Get It Done.
- Emergency maintenance services, such as street tree assessment and removals are also handled by Urban Forestry.
