A. Paddle for Peace; Presented by Risa Bell, Founder

Our mission is to diversify our coastal areas and to inspire others along the way. https://www.paddleforpeace.org/

Risa in attendance - Discussed bringing in kids and teaching about surfing, paddle boarding, ocean safety, touch on diversity of coast, barriers to access to the coast, expand reach in disadvantaged communities. Program offers to pick kids up, take them to the beach, teach them to surf, teach about the ocean, and promote job and learning opportunities. Free program open to all ages, 4 weeks in summer, 4 weeks in spring, and it serves lunch, picks up and drops off kids. Those interested can send an email from organization's website. Goal is to have a diverse coast in San Diego and help BIPOC kids feel comfortable in the ocean. Would like to connect with the Rec Centers. Do not offer swimming lessons at the moment.

7. ACTION ITEMS:

A. 3385 Sunrise St; Project No. PRJ-1093819, Cannabis Outlet Amendment to Conditional Use Permit (CUP); Presented by Techne Design and Development Request: Recommendation on CUP Amendment from SSDPG

3385 Sunrise Street (0.17-acre parcel) Amendment to CUP No. 2434653 to expand an existing Cannabis Outlet (CO) from 4,412-sf to 6,369-sf. The expansion proposes conversion of space at the lower level of the building (currently required to be vacant per the existing CUP), for a total square footage of 6,369 of CO.

Discussed what the business does for the community (hire locally, provide access to medicinal use, do not do local maintenance but do pay extra taxes to City that go to general fund), parking regulations (they are able to use this space now because parking restrictions are not in place), additional staff (a few but do not expect to congest area), proximity to public transportation, plans on reaching out to ownership to determine- what additional things are done for the surrounding community.

B. 440 1/3 35th St; Project No. PRJ-1073468, Extension of Time for Project 549188; Presented by DBR Design Studio

Request: Recommendation on Extension of Time from SSDPG

Tentative Map No. 1937933 and Site Development Permit No. 1937932 for the subdivision of 21 lots and the development of 20 dwelling units each with companion units totaling 29,110 square feet of floor area with open parking located at 440 1/3 35th Street. The project includes 15 percent affordable units (two units), density bonus of 50 percent and requesting four deviations.

**Project No. 549188 came before the SSDPG on June 10, 2019: Motion by Magagna, seconded by Pargo, to support the project with the recommendations from the Projects

Committee that this project needs better parking, lighting, security cameras, a plan on how to help residents get their trash to the trash bins, mature landscaping for screening for existing nearby homes, and some kind of recreation area as at least one amenity in this overly dense project. Approved 7-5-0 (voted for the motion of support with the SSDPG and area residents' concerns noted: Magagna, Pargo, Gomez, Leif, Noto, Torio, Urguby).

Discussed construction to begin in the next few weeks, covid set back, affordable housing component, units (20 units 9 units have an ADU - 2 of these will be low income including the granny flat, cannot be sold separately)
