SUMMARIES

Access, Inc.

Microenterprise Program

Access, Inc. has robust efforts to build awareness, recruit, and serve entrepreneurs. Providing marketing support to business owners is a key component to their programming. Many businesses are market vendors and need updated materials. The Capacity Building Grant funds helped cover direct business expenses and was used on the following: marketing materials and supplies, food industry permits, as well as direct consulting services.

All For Logan

Community Beautification

All For Logan empowers the Barrio Logan community through the various business programs and services offered with a focus on celebrating the community and preserving the rich history. Through the Capacity Building Grant, the organization focused on community beautification. Grant funds supported monthly maintenance and beatification in addition to covering key cultural event expenses such as supplies, marketing, and permits.

Bayside Community Center

Community-Supported Microenterprise Program

Bayside Community Center champions the residents of Linda Vista through services, education, and advocacy. The Community-Supported Microenterprise program provides direct support to small businesses with an emphasis on finance, marketing, operations, and licensing. The Capacity Building Grant funds provided programmatic expansion through software and hardware upgrades, increasing their ability to reach more microentrepreneurs in Linda Vista.

Business For Good

Business Development Events for Immigrant Business Owners

Business For Good unites business owners to make San Diego a better place for all. Business For Good advocates for immigrant-owned businesses and supports them with their business journey. The Capacity Building Grant funds helped cover two Citizenship Drives; each event was a workshop dedicated to a business owner's pathway to citizenship. Funds were used on consulting services, marketing, and other event specific expenses.



Chicano Federation of San Diego County

Business Support for Childcare Businesses

The Chicano Federation provides childcare-centered services through the Infant Toddler Care Program and Childhood Nutrition Program. Many childcare providers do not have the proper funds to access and purchase materials to continue advancing their businesses. With Capacity Building Grant funding, the Chicano Federation purchased materials and supplies for childcare business owners who are often women of color.

Convoy District Partnership

Promoting Cultural Identity

The Convoy District Partnership oversees the transformation of the greater Convoy area into a vibrant cultural center, dining destination, and innovative economic hub. The organization leveraged Capacity Building Grant funding to cover expenses related to marketing and promotion such as wayfinding signage in the form of street banners, flag banners, and installations. Funds also helped cover mural expenses.

Logan Heights Community Development Corporation (CDC)

Community Infrastructure and Business Promotion

Logan Heights CDC serves the Greater Logan Heights area through economic and community development. Logan Heights CDC used the Capacity Building Grant to invest in community needs including banner installations along Imperial Avenue. A key component is providing a cohesive identity that will bring returning visitors as well as new customers to the local business community.

Mid-City Community Music

Youth Business Support

Mid-City Community Music strives to amplify the voices of San Diego's most impacted and underserved youth by empowering them to tell their stories through art businesses that reflect their cultures, communities, and experiences. Through their Entrepreneurs Program they provide trainings to transition art hobbies into a business. With the Capacity Building Grant, Mid-City Community Music added training for youth in the Promise Zone and Opportunity Zones. Funds covered expenses for the cohort such as tablets.



Otay Mesa Chamber of Commerce

Technology and Marketing

The Otay Mesa Chamber of Commerce serves businesses in the Otay Mesa border region. They dedicate much of their efforts to communications and outreach within the area. The Capacity Building Grant assisted with communication efforts by supporting the organization's IT needs including software and cloud-based programs. Funds were also used on a business networking expenses with the goal of fostering collaboration between businesses.

San Diego African American Museum of Fine Art

Black Arts & Culture District Event

The mission of the San Diego African American Museum of Fine Art is to present and preserve the art of African Americans. The organization helps foster an appreciation of art through public programs and events. The Capacity Building Grant funds helped cover expenses for a community event intended to bring people to the commercial corridor of the district. The event also offered an opportunity to showcase local shops and vendors.

Via International

Supporting Microenterprise Home Kitchen Operations in Barrio Logan
Via International supports entrepreneurs on both sides of the border and
works collaboratively with community-based organizations. A key initiative
they are leading is identifying a space for local artisan entrepreneurs
(primarily women bakers) to build a collaborative kitchen space. With
Capacity Building Grant funds their organization covered the venue,
materials, and set-up for artisan product sales. Via International also
formalized other marketing and development components of their initiative.

Viet Vote

Activation in the Little Saigon District

Viet Vote is dedicated to serving the Vietnamese community by bridging resources, programs, and services into the community. With Capacity Building Grant funds their organization led the activation in the district through cultural decorations such lights and lanterns. Funds also contributed to the creation of a small business directory for the Little Saigon district and the promotion of the businesses in the community.
